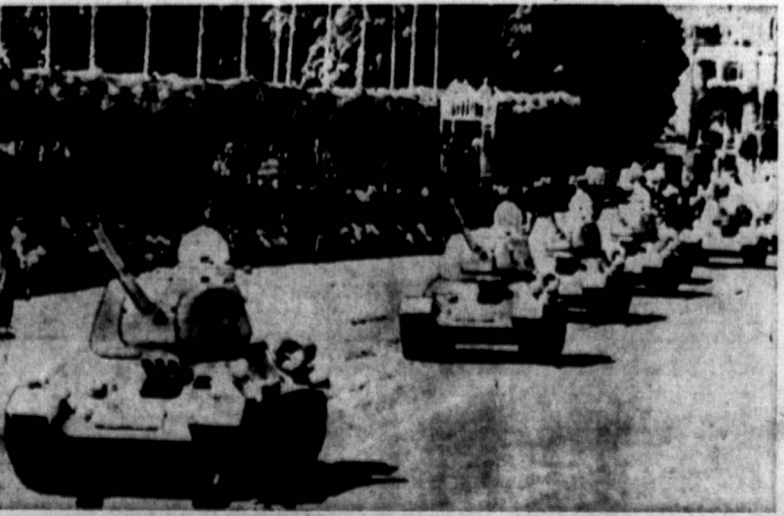

Bulganin, who was answering a June 16 letter from Macmillan, devoted more than half his remarks to the problems of disarmament. European security and Germany. At several points he linked the three issues. "The Soviet leader criticized the Macmillan government's disarmament policies in these words: "We are forming the impression that the British government is bringing about a state of affairs in which the accumulation and perfection of the most lethal and destructive means of warfare continues under cover of endless talks on the desirability of disarmament."
