### Sport Echoes From Prince County

It looks now as if paperweights, pee-wees, bantams and midgets are about to disappear as names of age divisions in baseball in Summerside. The new divisions will be Little League—ages 9 to 12; Little League—ages 13 to 15. Although this arrangement does not quite cover the Midget division, the chances are that any ball players over 15 will be grouped in a Junior division, part of the midget division and all of the juvenile division being tossed into the discards. As a matter of fact, the juveniles never did flourish in baseball here. The number of juniors was not sufficient to man a complete team, and the juvenes were recruited for the older division.)

Of course we don't know the entire set-up of this new minor baseball idea that comes from the U.S.A. They may have a "Bigger'n Better" or "Darn-Near Grown-Up" League for boys between 16 and 18 for all we know. It looks, however, as if for this year at least, the two new age divisions will be all that will be used here.

We think it's a good idea to join an organization with rules and regulations carefully worked out as this one apparently has. We like their precautionary measures, such as having helmets for the batters and not allowing the pitchers to pitch too many innings in one week. We understand, too, that the principle of good sportsmanship is not forgotten in this "Little League" and that players are encouraged to be good sports as well as good ball players.

VIENNA, May 6 — (AP) — Chile won the final two singles contests from Austria Monday to gain a 1-1 victory in the first round of the European Zone Davis Cup tennis eliminations. Chile will face sweden in the second round. Ricardo Balibiers clinched the series by outlasting Fred Huber in the first match today 6-4, 3-6, 1-6, 6-1.

Then 19-year-old Luis Ayala of Chile routed Gustav Specht, 6-1, 6-3, 6-1.

ISTANBUL, May 6 — (AP) — Switzerland split the final two singles matches with Turkey for an official 4-1 victory in the first round of the European Zone Davis Cup tennis eliminations. After Switzerland's Paul Blondel trounced Behbut Cevansir 6-3, 6-1, 6-3, Nazmi Bari scored Turkey's only triumph by defeating Erwin Balistrer, 6-2, 3-6, 6-3, 7-5.

Switzerland will play Argentina in the second round. MILAN, May 6 — (AP) — Italy swept the final two singles matches from Argentina to complete a 4-1 victory in their international tennis series patterned on the Davis Cup type of competition. Rolando Del Bello clinched the match for Italy by defeating Alejo Russell 6-2, 6-2, 6-4.
