

Whitey Ford Pitches Second Straight Shutout As Yankees Defeat Red Sox 3-0

Whitey Ford pitched his second straight shutout and third victory of the American League season Friday, leading Boston Red Sox to seven hits as New York Yankees defeated Frank Sullivan 3-0 with the help of homers by Yogi Berra and Hank Bauer.

The game was one of two day matches in the major leagues Friday. In the other, Chicago Cubs clubbed Cincinnati Redlegs 6-3 for their fifth National League victory in 10 starts.

At New York, the Yankees suffered a blow when second baseman Gerry Coleman received a multiple fracture of the collar bone in a home-plate collision with shortstop Owen Friend in the third inning. He will be out of action six to eight weeks.

Ford has allowed only one run in three starts this year and now has a string of 21 consecutive scoreless innings. Sullivan also had a perfect 2-0 record going into the game, witnessed by 724. He didn't allow a hit until Berra lined a pitch into the rightfield stands in the third for his second homer of the year. Bauer led off the sixth with his third homer of the season and Ford drove in Billy Hunter with a single for the final Yankee run.

It was the seventh straight loss for the hapless Pirates, who have yet to win a game.

After Bobby Morgan struck out, Mel Clark doubled to right field and then scored on Granny Hamner's triple. Smokey Burgess walked, Earl Torgeson singled and Del Egan put the game on ice with his three-run homer.

TWO-PART LEAGUE

We saw Pete play towards the end of his career and he could take a harder cut at a ball than any other man we ever saw. Pete Reiser had remained free from accidents, might have been the best baseball player who ever wore a uniform.
