Stoves to be gravelled and paved with a 3" thick base coat of asphalt.

Upper Queen from Kirkwood to Nassau.

Vicinity from Goodwill to St. Claire Avenue.

Prince of Wales Dr. from Goodwill to St. Claire Avenue.

St. Claire Ave. from Prince of Wales Drive to St. Claire Drive.

St. George Dr. from St. Claire Drive to Queen St.

West Water St. from St. George St. to Queen St.

21 following streets will be graded, gravelled and rolled only.

Queen Elizabeth Drive from North River Road to Second.

First Street from North River Road to "West".



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
