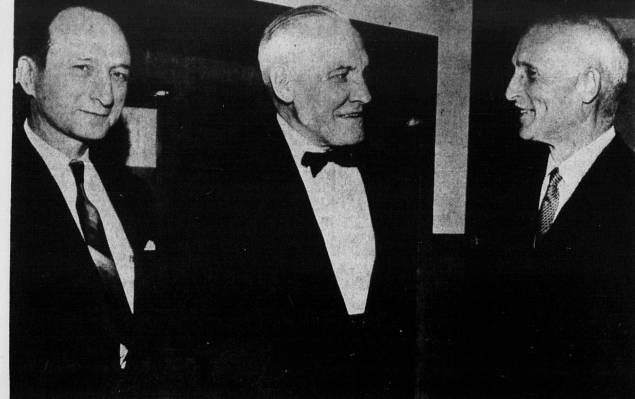

Soviets Push Effort To Head Off Disaster

MOSCOW (AP) — Working against a deadline, Soviet military and civilian engineers tried Monday to head off a disaster on a mountain landslide threatening the village of Zerkovsk.

The landslide is so unstable that holes have to be dug by hand to place the explosives, chief engineer Anatol Turkov told a Soviet correspondent at the scene.

Laboriously they hacked out holes 6 to 7 feet wide and 2.3 feet deep for the charges, reported made up of conventional blasting materials.
