TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

GREAT BRITAIN AND IRELAND.

LONDON, June 6.

At a land meeting near Dublin on Sunday the incident was a speech by Healy, in which he stated he was there in answer to the challenge of Secretary Forster, to repeat in Ireland what he (Healy) had said in Parliament. Healy said he might say he was there chiefly to reply to the challenge of "Buckshot Forster." That gentleman had challenged him to come to Ireland, and his answer to Forster was "Here I am."

Steamer Farady arrived at Penzance and will come here to procure the eastern shore end of the cable.

The British steamer Glenlogan, from New York, May 6th, for Para, Pernambuco and Bahia, took fire at sea and was abandoned. The crew and passengers were landed at Fortaleza, Brazil.

EUROPE AND THE EAST.

MADRID, June 6.

The active electoral preparations of the Carlists in the North and East provinces, and the recent communications that passed between the pretender and his agents in those districts and in Madrid, have decided the Government to order the authorities to watch their movements. The party has shown increased boldness since its local successes in the provincial and municipal elections.

BERLIN, June 6.

Forty military officers and twenty thousand rifles are expected in Sofia from Russia.

PARIS, June 6.

The last batch of communists have arrived from New Caledonia. Henri Vienstemp, the celebrated Belgian violinist is dead.

UNITED STATES.

NEW YORK, June 6.

It is stated the Federal officers here have information fixing the Mercey letter conspiracy and authorship, and arrests are expected daily.

Minthorne Tompkins died here yesterday, aged 74. He was the first Republican candidate for Governor of this State and was beaten by Horatio Seymour. His father served two terms as Vice-President of the United States.

The Herald states on the highest authority that Gen. Grant has not been invited to take part in the Senatorial contest, and if he should volunteer it is doubtful if it would be considered politic to accept his services.

Collector Robertson left here last night for Albany, and declared himself positively able to prevent the re-election of Conkling and Platt.

The employes of the larger beer breweries in this city and Brooklyn struck this morning for an increase of wages or decrease of hours of labor. The strikers congregated by hundreds in the neighborhood of the principal breweries of the city and discussed the situation peacefully.

NEW ORLEANS, June 6.

Gen. Grant and party arrived here on Sunday morning and left in the evening for St. Louis.

NEW YORK, June 6.

One thousand brewery employes struck, this morning, leaving nearly 40 breweries without help.

BUFFALO, N. Y., June 6.

A robbery of nearly \$100,000 in bonds from the Erie County Savings Bank has just come to light. A number have been traced to Baltimore.

DEADWOOD, Dakota, June 6.

A terrific hail and wind storm passed over this city, this afternoon, doing great damage. Hail stones the size of hen's eggs fell for over two hours; one stone measured 22 inches in circumference. One woman was killed and many other persons severely injured.

NEW YORK, June 6.

Ten brewing firms in this city have acceded to the demands of the strikers. Seven Brooklyn and three Jersey City firms have also yielded.
