

CURRENT NOTES.

Workmen who were digging up the roots of a tree on Lord Dorset's estate, at Cobham Hall, near Rochester, England, recently uncovered a large earthenware jar, containing nearly 900 Roman coins in bronze of the fourth century.

Mr. Eberts, secretary of the Qu'Appelle Valley Farming Co., who is in Ottawa, says the company have sown this season 1,500 acres of wheat and 2,000 acres of oats. The seed is of red fife No. 1, imported specially from Minnesota through the Department of Agriculture. The company have 50,000 acres and intend eventually putting the whole of it under cultivation.

The other night in South Boston, some burglars, not having the fear of the astatues before their eyes nor a due appreciation of the sanctity of the premises, broke into a Masonic lodge. They succeeded in getting away with fifty silver knives, fifty silver forks, two hundred fine cigars, besides several valuable articles of regalia. And now the wives of the Masons of that lodge want to know in what part of the mystic and austere rites so many spoons and knives and forks, not to speak of the cigars, played a part.

That fish is admirable brain food has long been maintained, but whether it is equally satisfying for physical purposes is a moot question. The guardians of Canterbury workhouse determined by actual experiment to solve the difficulty, and proceeded to feed the inmates on fish. But peppers, as the late Mr. Bumble remarked, are always "an ungrateful lot," and the inmates of the workhouse in question actually grumbled at being made the objects of experiments, and the meat diet had to be resumed, so that we are still left in doubt as to whether it is good for man to live on fish alone.

Scotland is now comparatively free from foot-and-mouth disease, except in two or three districts, and the fresh cases which have occurred during the past week are fewer in number than during any similar period since the unfortunate outbreak of the pest, now more than two months ago. The disease has appeared among a flock of over 300 sheep on the farm of Labothie, Forfarshire; and another case was discovered in Glasgow cattle market last week in an animal belonging to a cattle salesman. No new outbreak has occurred in East Lothian, where there are so many sheep affected; and otherwise there are symptoms of the disease dying out. The Berwickshire, Perthshire, and other authorities have agreed to petition the Privy Council against the importation of live stock from countries where disease is known to exist. Pleuro-pneumonia has reappeared on a farm in Ross-shire, but this is the only place in Scotland where the disease is known to exist.

The temperance movement is making remarkable progress in England. The revenue returns afford unanswerable proof of the decreased consumption of alcoholic liquors. Mr. Childers showed in the course of his recent Budget speech that the revenue from excise duties is now \$25,000,000 less than it was seven years ago. This indicates an enormous diminution in the consumption of beer and spirits throughout the United Kingdom. That this decrease is not due to hard times or commercial depression is proved by the steady increase in the consumption of tea during the same period. The English people are becoming more temperate. Drunkenness is not so fruitful a source of misery and crime as it has been. Education is enabling the working classes to overcome their passion for drink, is giving them the mastery over themselves, and is eking out the homely virtue of sobriety with the common sense of thrift.

John Kennedy, a farmer belonging to Willowdale, near Toronto, committed suicide on Thursday evening by hanging himself in his barn. Deceased had gone to Toronto in the morning with a load of hay, and it was immediately on his return that he committed the rash act. It is known that he had been drinking rather heavily while in the city, and was probably intoxicated when he returned. He was found by his hired man hanging in the barn, and was immediately cut down and Dr. Langstaff summoned. Although Kennedy was to all appearance dead, the doctor succeeded in restoring him to consciousness, but he died early the following morning. Deceased was at one time well-known in Toronto as a commission merchant on Front street, where he carried on business in partnership with Mr. Brunskill, but his dissipated habits forced him to return to his farm. He had attempted suicide on two or three occasions before, and about a year ago the stomach-pump was brought into requisition to save him from the effects of a large dose of laudanum. Deceased leaves behind him a wife and three children.

London News.

Lord Randolph Churchill is preparing a bill to disqualify atheists from sitting in Parliament.

The Duke and Duchess of Connaught will proceed to India in the autumn. The Duke obtains command of a division of the army.

There is over a foot of snow over a great part of Ireland, England, and Scotland. The heavy storms of snow and sleet have done great damage. In the north the snow is as heavy as during the winter, and thousands of lambs have died.

Herbert Spencer, Professors Huxley and Tyndall, John Morley, and about 200 of the leading literary and scientific men of England, signed a memorial to be presented to the Home Secretary protesting against the continuance of the imprisonment of Mr. Foote, editor of Free Thinker, for blasphemy, and asking for his release. Sir William Harcourt, it is understood, will refuse the petition.

The World's cable despatch says:—The Government has been defeated thrice within the last ten days; a fact which has had the result of weakening its prestige, and strengthening the popular belief that its downfall is approaching. The Ministers feel they cannot depend upon the majority, and it is understood that several of their number desire a fresh general election. The Transvaal question threatens to place the Government again in a minority. Should this happen Mr. Gladstone's position will become critical.

A late despatch says:—It is now known that the Government might have had a

small majority on the Affirmation Bill, but the whips arranged for a minority knowing that a workable majority was unattainable, as the bill was unacceptable to the Lords and possibly would be wrecked in committee. The Ministerial defeat on the India discussion on Tuesday was entirely owing to Lord Richard Grosvenor's bad whipping. The defeat of the Government on the Customs Revenue Bill arose from the members leaving town for Whitsuntide, and from the feeling of distrust as to whether Lord Grosvenor's whips were really serious, it being long felt that Lord Richard Grosvenor is a weak link in the Ministerial chain. Mr. Dodson, Chancellor of the Duchy of Lancaster is, another, but is a great favorite with Mr. Gladstone. His introduction of the Agricultural Holdings Bill was a full performance. He failed to show the extraordinary defects in the existing law, and almost invited the opposition that has since arisen. The Whitsuntide recess will be fortunate if it re-invigorates Liberals by contact with their constituents. The provinces do not share London views respecting the Government being shaken. Possibly after Whitsuntide Mr. Gladstone will hold a private meeting of the party to bind them together, for, although disintegration has not yet begun, it would clearly soon occur unless pressure is brought to bear.

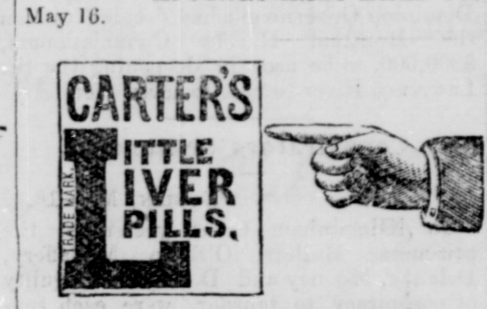
