Effective May 21st, from Montreal, Toronto and Vancouver the Trans-Canada Limited train service will be re-established by the Canadian Pacific Railway Company.

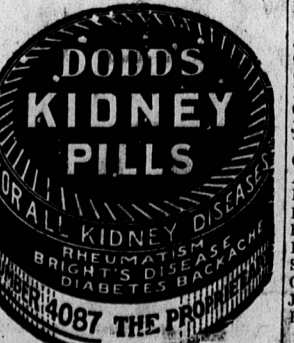

ALBERTON NOTES

While Mr. Lewis' loss is considerable, as the insurance does not any more than half cover the value of the building, the heavier toser is Mr. A. H. Ward, who had his jewelry business established there. He lost a considerable number of watches as well as some three or four hundred dollars' worth of tools.

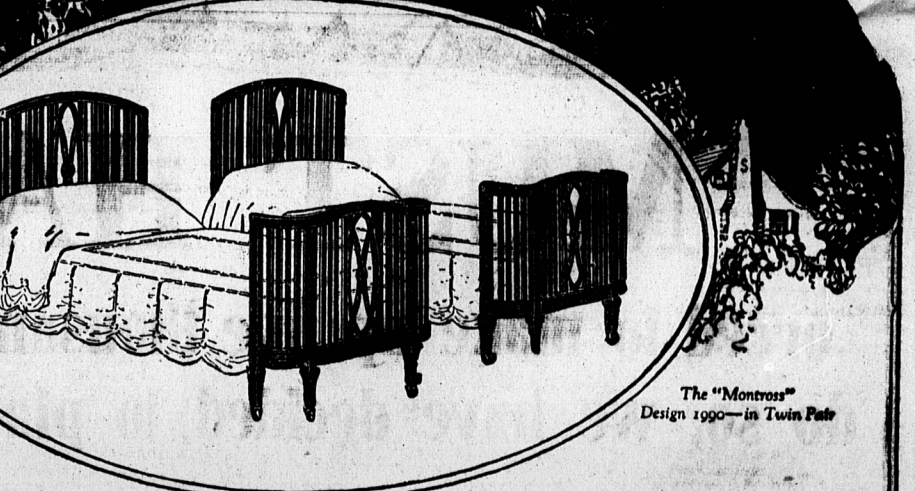
