OUR GOVERNMENT.

Sir—The House of Commons is the
representative part of the English
Parliament. Taxation and represen-
tation were ideas fundamentally as-
sociated in the English constitution.
We are in this Province changing
from the true principles of govern-
ment and are in very great danger
of sacrificing the liberty of the
great mass of the people. Formerly
when the people voted a tax to the
King they were accustomed to ask
for a redress of grievances or
some other boon or privilege.
As one historian expresses it, they
bought their liberty with hard cash.
The necessities of things were the
people's opportunity. We saw this
principle verified in the last two
contests or elections. The federal
necessity caused the expenditure of
much of the public money. The local
king's necessity required the pur-
chase of PINEAU, and much boot-
ling. In the 17th century a fierce
contest arose between King and
people; but the House of Commons
maintained that Parliament had the
sole right to make laws and vote
taxes. In this contest one king was
beheaded and another driven from
the realm. We anticipate a similar
fate will overtake our local King
in this Province unless he will mend
his ways.

A Proper Christmas Gift.

CHICAGO, Dec. 26.—Each of the
3,000 employes of the Cran com-
pany of this city have received as
Christmas presents from their em-
ployers an amount equal to 5 per
cent. of the aggregate of his
wages during the last year. The
total amount distributed reaches
\$100,000, the employes averaging
\$33 each.

Australian Cabinet.

SYDNEY, N. S. W., Dec. 26.—Sir
William John Tyne, premier of New
South Wales, who was recently re-
quested by the Earl of Hopetoun,
governor-general of the Common-
wealth of Australia, to form the
first federal ministry. He declined
the task. He had advised Lord
Hopetoun to summon Mr. Edmund
Barton, who was leader of the
federal convention during its ses-
sions in Adelaide, Sydney and Mel-
bourne in 1897 and 1898.
