

Miscellaneous.

Eleven hundred persons left Montreal by steamer recently, on a pilgrimage to St. Ann de Baupre.

The Goff forgery case was concluded at Montreal yesterday morning, as far as the forgery charges are concerned.

It is stated in Halifax, N. S., that Mr. Vail, the defeated of Digby, has been made Lieutenant-Governor of Nova Scotia.

The sales of coal from the Nova Scotia mines for the six months ending June 30, exceed the sales of the same period last year by forty-six thousand five hundred tons.

A criminal action is pending in Montreal against a prominent young stock operator for misappropriating trust funds to an amount in the neighborhood of \$20,000. Mr. W. H. Kerr, Q. C., is counsel for the defence.

Mr. W. T. Thomas, architect, of Montreal, has been successful in competition for building the new Trinity church and school at St. John, N. B. Ten sets of plans were submitted. The building is to cost \$70,000 and will be commenced immediately.

About forty Scotch immigrants arrived in Montreal yesterday morning, who came out in the Circassian, and left again on the train for Paris, Ont. They are from Linlithgow county, and are chiefly farmers. Four hundred Icelanders, who are en route for the Province of Keewatin, came out on the same steamer.

Thursday being the fiftieth anniversary of the formation of the first temperance society at Yarmouth, a grand demonstration was made there by the temperance people. A procession took place, when about ten thousand people are said to have been on the streets. Speeches were delivered in the rink by Dr. Miner, Geo. M. Dutcher, and others.

A dastardly and cruel act was perpetrated on Thursday morning at Clarksville. Some party or parties, supposed by many to be one of the leading men of the place, laid Paris green and salt as bait for cattle which had destroyed some three or four shade trees. The trap resulted in the death of three animals, and others were badly affected. The loss falls on parties unable to bear it.

Qarmouth is agitated on the question of water supply, to be brought in ten miles from Lake George and distributed at a cost of \$130,000.
