A \$40,000,000 PALACE. GIANT STRUCTURE TO SPAN THE MIGHTY NIAGARA CATARACT. Aladdin Quite Outdone in This Practical and Assured Project—The Latest Project to Utilize the Falls' 10,000,000 Horse Power. Niagara harnessed would, it is claimed, have the energy to furnish the motive power for all the machinery in the world. And Mr. Leonard Henkle of Rochester, N. Y., has a project to utilize the 10,000,000 horse power that the mighty falls generate every second, says the New York World, and that too, without harnessing those natural beauties but even enhancing it by a wonderful structure that is to be a work of art in itself. His scheme also has the advantage of diverting no water from the river and it is regarded as so thoroughly feasible that New York and Toronto capitalists have guaranteed the interest on \$40,000,000 and the work will be done in six years. Henkle proposes nothing less than the erection of a stupendous structure, to be called "The Great Dynamic Palace and International Hotel," which will bridge the great cataract. This palace, located about fifty feet above the brink of Horseshoe Falls, will be at least a mile long and to width 1,000 feet; the height will be 600 feet, the centre, however, rising to about 1000 feet above the river. The lower part of the structure will be three to forty-six stories, and in the centre something more than fifty stories. The structure will be supported and anchored by two massive stone towers, fixed on the river banks, each elevated 90 feet from the bank. These towers will be each 48 feet in thickness, 1,600 feet wide, 200 feet high and will weigh 100,000 tons apiece. The materials of construction provided in the specifications are stone, granite, Mexican onyx, black and white marble, aluminum, copper, steel, iron and glass. The structure will be divided into three parts, the east and west wings and the main building. The wings will each be 502 feet in length and the central portion 836 feet long. The exterior will consist of block stone, fretted and ornamented. The building will be supported by forty huge columns, which are to be presented by the nations of the world. Promises have already been obtained from some of them. The columns will be furnished. They will be richly sculptured and the motto of the nation presenting each will be inscribed at its base. They will also have the name of the nation set in gold, silver or aluminum letters at the top. Eight hundred smaller columns, composed of Mexican onyx and aluminum will also be used. At the American end of the building above the main entrance, will be inscribed "United States of America," and at the Canadian entrance, "Ontario, Dominion of Canada." Above the central entrance will be the word "United States of America." Inside the building steel girders will be used to support the roof; iron columns will also be placed between the floors. Forty-seven million, five hundred and twenty thousand feet of lumber will be required, which, it is estimated, will cost about \$475,200. The structure will have 11,522 windows and a corresponding number of doors. The first ten stories will be used for dynamo and other apparatus for generating electricity. At the extreme lower front of the building proper, there will be ten turbine wheels, capable of developing about 3,300,000 horse power a minute, which will run over 7,000 dynamos. Immediately below the first story an immense arcade will furnish a passage from the United States to Canada for the Grand Trunk, West Shore and other railways. This will be lighted with thousands of arch and incandescent lights. Above the tenth story and up to the forty-fifth, the building will be used for commercial purposes. The capacity of 70,000, which may be addressed by one speaker by the use of electrical instruments. This hall will be the most beautiful in the world. The design for a window, and it is estimated that the furnishings of the hall will cost \$5,000,000. With regard to the practicability of his scheme, Mr. Henkle says: "After disposing of 200,000 horse power at the falls at \$10 per horse power per annum, 5 per cent, is assured on \$4,000,000 which will produce 200,000 horse power, which, at \$1 per horse power, would insure an income of such vast proportions as to pay an annual and perpetual sum of over \$2,000,000. It is sufficient to build railways from California to Maine, and from British Columbia to the St. Lawrence, each touching at Niagara Falls, and to build a line of steamships from the outlet of the St. Lawrence to every port of the world."
