Famous R. C. M. P. Band Most Favorably Received Here

Citizens of Charlottetown yesterday turned en masse to see and hear the famous Royal Canadian Mounted Police Band from Ottawa which is currently making a tour of Eastern Canada.

At 4:30 in the afternoon the band gave a marching display on Richmond Street in front of the Provincial Building. The 42 member musical group were most impressive as they executed military precision marches to airs that proved most popular to the many who left their work temporarily to watch the "Red Coats" on parade.
