## IN MEMORIAM

MRS. JOHN J. MACISAAC

Many hearts were saddened on Friday, May 2nd, when it was learned that Mrs. Eliza MacIsaac of Borden, widow of the late John J. MacIsaac had passed away. Mrs. MacIsaac had been confined to her bed for a few weeks but it was hoped with a good rest she would soon be around again. But God willed otherwise and in the early morning hours of May 2nd her gentle spirit fled to the Lord who gave it.

Born in Cape Traverse in 1888, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. John Clark, she spent her early years there. Her parents owned the Lansdowne Hotel when the railway had its terminal at Cape Traverse and many of the older residents remember Mrs. MacIsaac or "Tisey," as she was familiarly known, in connection with their younger days when she helped make the Lansdowne Hotel a home away from home for the travellers and railway men.

In 1919 she married John J. MacIsaac, a C.N.R. engineer and they came to Borden which had now become the railway terminus. Here they made their home, raised their family, and worked for the betterment of the Town. Her husband, predeceased her by seventeen years.

"Tisey," by her fine personality and companionship, her devotion to every good cause, and the whole-hearted hospitality of her home, was highly esteemed by a wide circle of friends and acquaintances. She will be greatly missed in the family circle who in the last few years of declining health had provided her with every comfort, care and fellowship that could be desired.

During her latter years she was a faithful member of the Sacred Heart Church at Borden, and died fortified by the last rites of the church provided by her pastor, Rev. Reginald F. MacDonald. She leaves to mourn her passing, three daughters and a son,

Jean (Mrs. Frank Butler), Charlottetown, Pauline (Mrs. David MacLeod), Borden, Eleanor and Jack at home; and seven grand-children; also an adopted sister, Mildred (Mrs. Frank Howatt), Carleton Place.

Funeral service was held in Sacred Heart Church, Borden, on Monday, May 5th, where Solemn Requiem High Mass was celebrated by Rev. R. F. MacDonald, assisted by Rev. T. P. Butler as Deacon, Rev. Austin Bradley as Sub-deacon, and Rev. P. F. Hamill as master of ceremonies. Rev. Fr. MacDonald conducted the services at the grave.

Interment was in St. Peter's cemetery, Seven Mile Bay, Pallbearers were Arthur Dawson, Ernest MacNevin, James V. MacDonald William White, Eber Bell and Wilfred Kiggins.

The many people who called at the home, spoke silently of the fine impression this gracious lady had made on her generation.
