NAVAL RESERVE FOR CAN- ADA.

Proposal That Our Fishermen
Be Trained
For Defence of Their Country.

OTTAWA, Jan. 24.—It is believed that the outspoken utterances of Hicks-Beach on Canada's obligations towards engaging in the defense of the empire will greatly strengthen the efforts of the naval league to induce the Government to undertake the training, as naval reserve men, of the hardy fishermen of the Maritime Provinces during the winter months when thousands of men are idle. Some time ago Captain Spain, Commandant of the Fisheries Protective Service, drew up a scheme for the information of the Government on the subject, and it is now reported that the Government will ask Parliament at the coming session, or \$50,000 towards putting it into effect.

LATEST NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL.

OTTAWA, Jan. 21.—The trade returns show an increase in exports of nearly \$6,000,000.

OTTAWA, Jan. 21.—Mr. Sifton says that there is no truth that Yankee soldiers will enter Canadian territory with the Yukon relief expedition.

OTTAWA, Jan. 21.—A deputation representing the manufacturers of shirts saw Messrs Fielding and Patterson yesterday to ask, either that the duty on cotton used for manufacturing shirts be reduced, or that the duty on the manufactured article be increased.

THREE RIVERS, Que., Jan. 21.—During the absence from home this evening of Mrs. Robert, a coal oil lamp exploded. A baby of six months and a child of two years were so badly burned they will probably die. The only other occupant of the house at the time was a four-year old girl, who escaped uninjured.

LONDON, Jan. 22.—A special despatch from Shanghai, dated Friday, says that France has purchased three Chinese steamers, and is trying to acquire others, for conversion into transports. According to the same despatch, the Japanese squadron will sail from Yokohama today (Saturday) for Chinese waters.

CALCUTTA, Jan. 21.—The bill introduced by Sir James Westland, the finance minister, on January 14, providing for the issue of currency notes in India against gold, was adopted today, with the condition that the secretary of state be given the option of paying gold into the treasury, provided India pays an equal sum into the currency department here. The bill has already relieved the stringency of the money market.

NEW YORK, Jan. 21.—Bradstreet's says the Canadian trade situation is one of confident strength. Toronto reports business for January ahead of last year in spite of mild weather and bad roads. Retailers are placing liberal orders. The reduction in the price of Canadian refined sugar has checked the import of foreign refined. Prices of peas have advanced 13 cents per bushel since Jan. 1, as a result of the short crop. This and the high prices of oats have caused heavy imports of American corn for stock feeding. At Montreal orders for dry goods are coming in freely to jobbers and the outlook for spring trade is regarded as good. Boot and shoe manufacturers are active at that city and Quebec. Halifax reports the Newfoundland herring catch finer than for many years. Failures in the dominion show a further falling off, amounting this week to only 46, against 58 last week, 57 in this week of 1897, 52 in 1896 and 48 in 1894, but slightly exceeding those of 1895, which numbered 38. Canadian bank clearings this week aggregate \$26,640,000, a decrease of 11 1/2 per cent. over this week a year ago.

BRUSSELS, Jan. 21.—While a cage containing 15 miners was being hoisted in the shaft of the Bonne Esperance mine at Wansee, in Hainaut, the cable broke and the occupants of the cage were dashed to pieces.

LONDON, Jan. 21.—It is reported that Japan has purchased the Brazilian cruiser Ab en, now building on the Tyne, and has also bought the Brazilian ironclads Doodora and Floriano, which are constructing in France. Agents of the Spanish government have been in London trying to arrange for the purchase of these vessels, but it is understood that they were unable to raise the necessary money.

NEW YORK, Jan. 21.—One of the most remarkable conversations on record took place in this city yesterday. It was carried on over a telephone wire. At one end of the wire Captain was Charles Jacques, superintendent of the Holland Submarine Boat Company, in the New York office of that concern. At the other end of the wire sat Simon Lake, in the cabin of the submarine boat Argonaut, eight miles out in Baltimore harbor and 65 feet under water. A fairly stiff gale was blowing up about, but Mr. Lake's wonderful craft crawling along steadily on its submarine way, paying out its cable as it went, and Mr. Lake's voice could be heard in New York just as clearly as if the speaker was on dry land.
