The treaty with Spain, which opens the Spanish West Indies to the products of Canada on terms similar to those accorded to all imports entering under the Spanish flag, has caused no small stir across the border.

The upshot of the treaty is that the Dominion is to have a better commercial standing in the Spanish possessions than has the United States. The result should be beneficial to our trade.

The Canadian Pacific railway, the establishment of a Pacific steamship line, and the laying of a Pacific cable, all tend to make a treaty with the Sandwich Islands probable and possible.

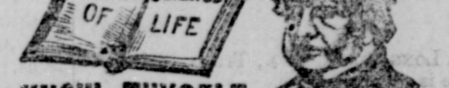
