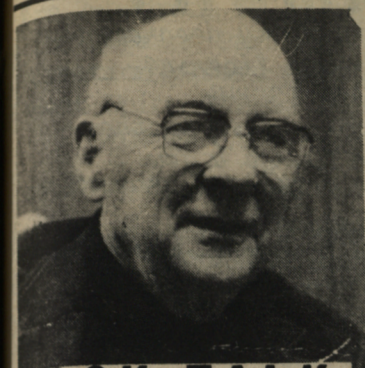


# MIKE 'SOMETHINK OR OTHER'
