

Jane Azoff Wins Truro Free-for-all

(By The Canadian Press) TRURO, N.S., July 2—Opening program of the Nova Scotia harness racing circuit for 1939 was interrupted Saturday by rain before final heats in all classes could be run off. A record crowd of 3,000 who sat through a drizzle, before the heavy downpour opened up, saw a Prince Edward Island pacer and a Truro import from the upper Canadian circle hold the spotlight.

Jane Azoff, the Island mare, paced two fine heats to take first in the free-for-all class. She beat out Buck Hanover in the first heat and led Simcoe Harvester home by half a length in the second.

In the 2.28 event, San Tom of Truro, with the veteran Jimmy Sanderson in the sulky, staged the nicest racing of the day in taking two straight heats. He nosed out Hal Britton in each race.

Sully took the opening heat of the classified race, but Walter Brown came from behind in the second to win in a close finish.

Protana took two straight heats from five horses in the 2.26 class, while Ethel Bellini and Miss Sumner provided the competition. Protana nosed out the Bellini mare in the second heat when she lost her stride in the home stretch.
