NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP) - The stock market rose to a 1956 high Wednesday by a thin margin.

Unusually sharp rises for Commonwealth Edison, Eastman Kodak and American Telephone featured the market.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks rose 70 cents to 136.60, 10 cents higher than the mark set Aug. 11. Industrials rose 80 cents, rails 30 cents and utilities 60 cents.

Commonwealth Edison showed a net gain of 3c. This stock was up 5 1/2 at one time following word from the firm's chairman that the company expects to pay out approximately the full amount of earnings in dividends each year.

Amoco, the Canadian issuer, Edison Bay Mining rose 1/2. Distillers Seagrams and International Nickel 1/2 each, Canadian Pacific and Granby Mining 1/4 each and Aluminum Ltd. 1/4.

Shawinigan was up 1/4 and Canadian Marconi 1/2 in the Canadian list on the American exchange. Brazilian Traction lost 1/4.

TORONTO (CP) - Golds and western oils each gained more than one-half point while base metals were up one-quarter on the stock market today.

New Mylamagne accounted greatly for the increased volume as it traded 720,210 shares. It gained 10 cents at 63 cents. New Hosco was up 12 cents at \$1.52 on 167,558 shares while O'Brien scored a 2 cent increase at \$1.10. All five most active mines gained.
