The event also celebrated Mr. Profit's 80th birthday and he was the recipient of a desk set, presented by Councillor William Blakeney. An address, read by Councillor P. J. Kennedy congratulated the celebrant on reaching his 80th birthday in good health and with unimpaired faculties, paid tribute to his faithful and unselfish service over the past years, and wished him many more years of health and enjoyment of life. Other speakers included Mayor Darrach. Table decorations included a birthday cake made by Mrs. Paynter.

Later the same evening friends, relatives and neighbors gathered at Mr. Profit's home to join him in celebrating his birthday. Mr. R. A. Profit, Freetown acted as Master of Ceremonies and the guest of honor was the recipient of many lovely gifts. Mrs. W. C. He also taught in Kensington for a short time, vacating that position to become secretary-treasurer and manager of Kensington-Hamilton Cheese and Butter Factory, duties of which he capably fulfilled for 25 years.

When the town of Kensington was incorporated in 1913, Mr. Profit was appointed Magistrate, a position he has continued to fill up to the present time.
