The sponsorship started in October. Bernardine sends a total of \$276.00 a year to aid not only Elizabeth but the rest of her family and community.



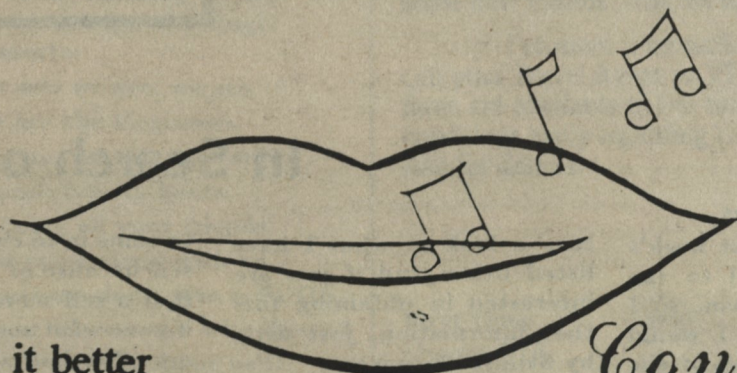
The family's only other income is the \$80 (U.S.) a month her brother-in-law earns as a private driver.
