Plans Debate On Penal Reform OTTAWA, (CP)—Senator David Croil served notice Monday night he planned to launch a Senate debate on the need for penal reform in Canada.

The Senator, former Liberal Commons member for Toronto Spadina who was appointed to Upper House last July, said he will open the debate Feb. 21 by pointing out the "need for further reforms in the Canadian penal system."

It is understood a number of other senators, including Muriel Ferguson, Thomas Reid (British Columbia), Nancy Hodges (British Columbia) and Donald Cameron (Ind.-Lib-Alberta), will take part in the debate.
