Montague Discusses Memorial School Sale

MONTAGUE — The Royal Canadian Legion, Montague branch, should be given the first opportunity of purchasing the Montague Memorial School if and when it is to be disposed of, this was the opinion of ratepayers present at a meeting called by the trustees as the result of a letter from the legion, asking to have a meeting to discuss the matter.

The Memorial School houses several classes from the new Montague Regional High School unit. These classes are expected to be moved to their new quarters in the new wing of the regional school early in 1963. This will most likely leave the memorial school vacant.

Most speakers were in favour of holding on to the memorial school in case of an overflow from the elementary school or in case such as at present in connection with the regional high school. However the opinion of others was that this could be quite costly considering up-

Kings MP Named To 5 Committees

OTTAWA — Mrs. Margaret MacDonald, MP for Kings, has been selected to sit on five of the standing committees of the Commons.

The five are: public accounts, a 30-member committee with a quorum of 15; agriculture, a 60-member committee with a quorum of 20; marine and fisheries, a 35-member committee with a quorum of 10; veterans affairs, a 40-member committee with a quorum of 15; and the restaurant committee of 25 members who direct the parliamentary restaurant and cafeteria.

The committees are proportionately representative of all four parties in the Commons. They are just now being organized, chairman and vice chairman selected, and their work outlined. Standing committees deliberate on questions of interest to their field, and make regular reports and recommendations to parliament. They have the power to call witnesses to give statements or answer questions.

In addition to the standing committees of the house, Mrs. MacDonald has also been appointed a member of the legislative caucus committee on labor matters.

Heifer Places 3rd In Canada

Bargate Bonnie Dale has completed a two-year old production record which placed her third in Canada in her class, in the period listed in the current issue of the Holstein-Friesian Journal. She is a member of J. Lincoln Dewars Bargate farm herd at New Perth, and she was the calf that was fed, groomed and shown by Miss Dale Dewars as a 4-H club member two years ago. Dale won first place at her club achievement day with the calf, placed third at the provincial exhibition and fourth at the B. C. Youth Fair the same year.

Bonnie Dale produced 14,421 pounds milk, 620 butterfat for a 4.39 per cent. She had a breed class average of 132 in milk and 104 in fat at the end of the 305-day period. D.C.A. are not computed on the full 365 days.

The heifer was sired by Beckhaven B. A. Benefactor who is a son of Gleaner Benefactor, one of the top Canadian Holstein sires of a few years ago.
