 OTTAWA (CP)—The holiday season may be putting a crimp in normal plans for next February's annual general meeting of the Progressive Conservative party.

Officials won't disclose the nature of the resolutions so far submitted.  
 It is being taken as a safe bet, however, that there are conflicting views on such questions as the continued leadership of the party by John Diefenbaker, and whether a vote of confidence in his leadership should be taken in open session or by secret ballot.

Party practice is to use the secret ballot only for the election of a new leader or executive officers of the association. Young Progressive Conservative groups in Toronto and Montreal have asked for a secret ballot on the confidence question.

# Second Stage Revealed Of Redistribution Plans

OTTAWA (CP) — The government has unveiled the second stage of legislation which will result in a new shaping of virtually every parliamentary constituency in Canada.  
 As provided for in an earlier bill, the job will be done by 10 commissions — one for each province — under the general direction of the new representation commission: Nelson Casagony, the present chief electoral officer.  
 The bill introduced in the Commons by State Secretary Pickergill spells out the rules which the 10 commissions must follow in drawing constituency maps to account for population changes since the last redistribution of seats in 1952. Hitherto redistribution has been done by a parliamentary committee on the basis of the decennial census. The law requires a redistribution on completion of the census but there has been none since the 1961 census pending legislation to set up independent tribunals to handle the job.  
 On the basis of current constitutional requirements, the Commons will have 264 seats, one less than at present. But the total seats are almost certain to be increased to at least 280 because of prospective seat losses in Nova Scotia, Quebec, Manitoba and Saskatchewan. The new bill, called the Elec-

torial Boundaries Readjustment Act, provides first for selection of commission members from nominees of the governing party and the chief opposition party in the Commons—Liberals and Progressive Conservatives, respectively.  
 Each party leader will name one member. The provincial chief justice will name a chairman for each commission from among his fellow judges. If a judge isn't available for the task, the chief justice of the Supreme Court of Canada will pick a chairman.

**FOURTH MEMBER**  
 The fourth number on each commission will be Mr. Casagony as representation commissioner.

The total number of MPs for each province will be divided into the total population of that province to arrive at a basic size of constituency for that province. Each of the 10 commissions must keep as closely to that basic figure as possible.

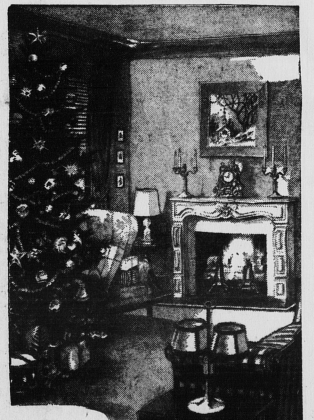
