THE GANDALPH SCHOLARSHIP

Tenable to any student completing the second-last year of a recognized degree program at a Canadian university which includes sufficient course study in one or more of physics, engineering or the computer sciences, and who, upon completion of a degree program would be eligible for entering the data communications field at a technical level is eligible to apply for the Gandolph scholarship. DEADLINE IS MARCH 3.

ROBERT AND MARY STANFIELD FOUNDATION UNDERGRADUATE BILINGUAL EXCHANGE SCHOLARSHIPS IN CANADIAN STUDIES

This programme is offered to undergraduate students who have completed at least one year of a university degree program, and attained high academic standing. The language of study shall be French in the case of English-speaking winners and English in the case of French-speaking winners. Valued at \$3,500. DEADLINE IS MARCH 1.

A student must intend to pursue a college course directed toward a career in exploration Geophysics. Eligible to an undergraduate college student whose grades are above average, or, a graduate college student whose studies are directed toward a career in exploration Geophysics either operations, teaching or research.
