FIRE CARD SHARK — Moscow (Reuters) — The Soviet Communist party newspaper Pravda reports the firing of a party official in Kazakhstan who "regularly organized card games" with other party government and agricultural officials. Pravda said Monday that before S. T. Toklamysov was fired as first secretary of Kyzyl-Oblast in southern Kazakhstan, "widespread theft, polygamy, marriage to minors, parasitism, drunkenness and card-playing" had gone unchecked there. Other leading officials who counseled Toklamysov's actions also were fired.

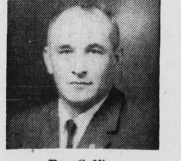
