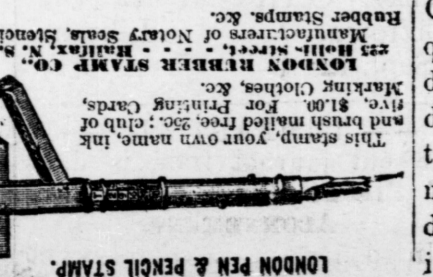

**LE DEPEUPEMENT DES CAMPAGNES**

Un des plus grands maux de notre société est l'attrait effréné qu'exercent les villes sur nos jeunes gens de la campagne. Ils abandonnent leur famille, leurs champs, pour courir après les gains problématiques que permettent les emplois sédentaires. Ils ont soif de jouissances matérielles et ont horreur de la vie tranquille et régulière de leur village. A demi instruits, ils se croient des savants et aptes à remplir les fonctions les mieux rétribuées. Il s'en vient les mains blanches des citadins et sont honteux des mains calleuses de leur père.

Et les villes s'empressent de déclasser, de quémandeurs, de gens pleins de bonne volonté au début, mais dont le caractère est promptement aigri par les déceptions. Après mille déboires, des démarches et des fatigues innombrables, après avoir épuisé les quelques économies qu'ils avaient, quelques-uns réussissent à trouver un emploi rémunérateur; les autres, et ce sont les plus nombreux, se voient réduits à la misère et obligés de mendier leur pain.

Aussi voit-on grossir dans des proportions effrayantes, l'armée des criminels, des suicidés, des souteneurs, des prostituées.

Pendant ce temps, nos paysans protestent contre le manque et la cherté des ouvriers agricoles. Leurs gains deviennent dérisoires; ils recourent aux emprunts pour faire face aux besoins les plus pressants et, quand les intérêts à payer absorbent les bénéfices, l'expropriation de leur patrimoine consomme leur ruine.

La certitude de l'immortalité de l'âme, du jugement divin; les espérances de la vie bienheureuse des saints ou la crainte des châtements éternels peuvent, seules, avec la grâce divine, comprimer les passions humaines, rendre les hommes aptes à comprendre les joies de la vie tranquille et laborieuse des agriculteurs, modérer leurs desirs, éteindre la soif après du gain, leur donner la conscience nette et précise de leur savoir et de leur intelligence.

Aussi, de même qu'autrefois Rome croyait qu'elle ne serait jamais en sécurité tant que Carthage existerait, de même que Caion terminait tous ses discours par ces mots: "delenda est Carthago," il faut détruire Carthage, de même nous ne devons pas nous lasser de nous écrier: "delenda est impietas," il faut détruire

l'impie," le Christ doit régner de nouveau sur tous les cœurs, si nous ne voulons périr.

**THE ABJURATION OF A GRAND MASTER OF THE FREEMASONS**

After six months of preparation, Signor Zola, a very eminent member of the Masonic body, and a Grand Master of Egyptian Lodge, according to the so-called Scottish Rite, abjured the sect in which he had held a leading position for thirty years and with hearty contrition returned to the faith of his childhood and was received by Mgr. Sallua at the Holy office on Saturday, April 18. Grand Master, Grand Hierophant, and Sovereign Grand Commander of Egyptian Masonry, were some of the titles which proclaimed M. Zola, [perhaps a relation of the novelist] a shining light in the Order; and in hopes that it may influence other members of the Freemason body, who, in England especially, have not the remotest idea of its evil tendencies, we here give the text of his solemn abjuration:  
"I, the undersigned, Solitaire Avventore Zola, ex-Grand Master and ex-Commander of the Masonic Order in Egypt and its dependencies, declare that I have been in that sect for 30 years; and that for the last twelve, I directed the order as an absolute sovereign, so that I had ample time and opportunity to study its origin and tenets and also the end it proposes in its laws and doctrines.  
"Freemasonry proclaims itself a PURELY philanthropic, philosophic, and progressive institution, having for its sole objects a search after truth, the study of universal science and art, and the exercise of charity and beneficence. It professes the utmost respect for the religious faith of each of its members; and affirms that it formally interdicts, in its assemblies or meetings, any discussion of religious or political matters, or any controversies on such subjects. It declares that it is neither a religious nor a political institution; but is a temple of justice, humanity, charity, etc. Well, I here solemnly affirm that all these Masonic declarations are absolutely false. The pretended religious liberty in its laws and ritual does not exist. It is not only a lie but a shameless one. This pretended justice, love of humanity, philanthropy, and charity, have no place whatever in the real Masonic temples, nor in the hearts of the leading Freemasons; for they, with rare exception, neither know nor practice any such virtues. Truth does not exist in Freemasonry, nor in any of those who fill the highest grades in the Order. In the sect itself, lying, deceit, and perfidy are the sovereign rulers; and those

pretended virtues are simply put forward as the mask to blind men of honour and good faith, and to induce them to join a body of persons whose principles they would abhor if they knew what they really were.

"In truth, I hereby declare that Freemasonry is an institution, the scope of which is to undermine and destroy every form of religion, and especially the Catholic faith; and to try and substitute a diabolic worship and the restoration of humanity to primitive Paganism.

"Now that I am thoroughly convinced of this fact, and that I have for thirty years professed and preached Masonic doctrines, and induce other persons to follow me in that fatal error, I can only express my hearty sorrow and repentance. God having vouchsafed to enlighten me on the subject, I fully recognize the harm I have done; and have hastened to send in my resignation of all masonic rights and dignities (to the Supreme Council of the 33); and abjure with the Church, all the sins I have as a Mason committed.

"I beg pardon of our Lord for all the scandal given by me during the time I belonged to the sect. I further beg pardon of our Holy Father, Pope Leo XIII., and of all those to whom I may have been a scandal.
