

# Chicago Defeats Cincinnati 2-1

CHICAGO (AP)—Ken Hubbs drove a home run into the left field bleachers Tuesday and gave Chicago Cubs a come-from-behind 2-1 victory over Cincinnati Reds.

The victory enabled the Cubs to snap a four-game losing streak in the season's first meeting with Cincinnati. The game was the only day action in the majors.

Pitcher Joe Nuxhall drove in the only Cincinnati run in the eighth. Catcher Johnny Edwards led off the inning with a home run. Harper ran for Edwards and reached second on Gordy Coleman's sacrifice.

Then Nuxhall singled sharply to center, scoring Harper and fielding a scoreless double play.

The Reds had a runner aboard in the ninth as Andy McDaniel mopped up for winner Dick Ellsworth when Frank Robinson singled with one out.

After Leo Cardenas filed out, the game ended on Robinson's unsuccessful attempt to steal second base.

# Cough Epidemic Virus Isolated

CHICAGO (AP)—A virus believed responsible for a severe coughing epidemic that has afflicted both children and adults, has been isolated by research teams in Florida and Kentucky.

The virus was isolated Tuesday as several trotting tracks were forced to close because of the virus in a race at Stan Bergstein of Chicago, director of the Harness Racing Institute, said the virus was isolated from thoroughbred horses infected at Gulfstream Park near Miami and from trotters struck at Buffalo Raceway, Hamburg, N.Y.

The U.S. Public Health Service is investigating. James S. Stone, chief of the Communicable Disease Center in Atlanta, said that as far as he can tell, the disease does not appear to be associated with the equine outbreak.

The coughing, which formerly afflicted only the two-year-old thoroughbred racehorses, is now afflicting older horses as well this year, starting in Florida last winter. It had not seriously bothered trotters until recently.
