BRUTAL ASSAULT AT SOURIS. On Saturday night last a row started in one of the Souris free trade establishments. Blows were exchanged freely. One of the combatants, Pius McKinnon, the same individual who caused a disturbance at Senator Wood's meeting and who was on that occasion summarily ejected from the Hall—went outside and picked up a heavy hand-saw, with which he threatened to go for the first man who made him an answer. The first to appear, as it happened, was Michael Sweeney of Bear River line Road. McKinnon at once struck him full swing, leveling him to the ground. It was thought at first that Sweeney was killed. Doctors were sent for who found a large wound from which the blood flowed freely. The cheek bone was fractured badly by the blow. Sweeney remained unconscious for several hours, after which he was taken to his home. He is a man about 60 years of age, married and has a family. McKinnon was promptly arrested by A. Steele and D. O'Brien, Constables, who still have him in custody.

A Grit meeting was held at Mr. Cartney McLane's warehouse, Murray River, on Saturday afternoon. The great politicians from Charlottetown were out in full force, consisting of Mr. Davies, H. C. McDonald, L. E. Prowse, etc., flanked by the Georgetown and Cardigan contingents. Messrs. Springour, D. A. McKinnon and Dr. Robertson. It was a purely one-sided affair, no Conservative being allowed even to ask a question for information; and of course no reply was allowed to the extravagant and wild assertions of the "stretcher" Mr. Davies stated that he was entirely opposed to the Branch Railway in P. They had the opportunity and improved it thoroughly. The member for Squaw Bay seems to have been ruled out entirely by his party, as he was not allowed to speak. Dr. Robertson from Montserrat and D. A. McKinnon from Georgetown, with the "wonderful cheap" man from town, got in their little quota. Mr. Davies, with amazing effrontery, got off some incredible statements, and wound up with a few old chestnuts—the horse story and the story of the minister (we have them all by heart now), and was followed by the great Gow from Cardigan, who soon emptied the warehouse, and the meeting ended.

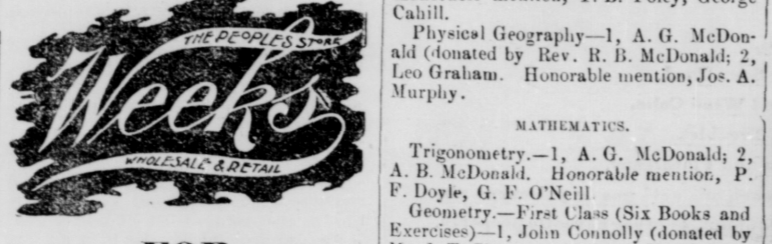

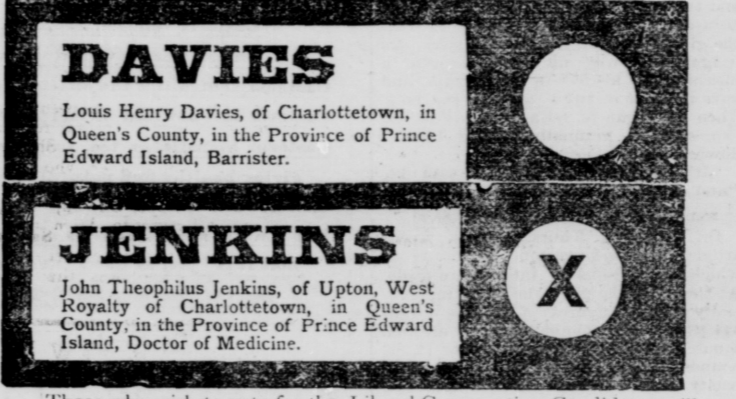
