## Where Winter Carnival Is At

Carnival this year is from January 22 - 26th and has a different format than in previous years. Wade MacLaughlan, this year's Chairman has been working since the semester began, on events and booking groups for entertainment. In order to get a clear vision of what is happening, Wade has written up the following report of up to date activities:

We have a very encouraging report from the Winter Carnival Committee. This year a very novel approach is being taken towards organizing carnival. Each class organization will be responsible for hosting a certain portion of the four and a half day festival. Last Thursday, each class held meetings and, although the turnout was less than might have been hoped, the enthusiasm was more than compensatory.

The Junior class has drawn Wednesday and Sunday as the segment of carnival for which they will be responsible. They see Wednesday as being crucial to setting the pace for Carnival. They are planning a big torch-light parade which will start downtown and will end up at the campus for the official opening. It is hoped that most on-campus organizations will enter floats, that local dignitaries will participate, and that our carnival Queen contestants will be present.

After the parade, a bash will take place in the gym with music by Sun Machine from Halifax. This will be followed by a square-dance in front of Main with a fiddler and caller on the balcony.

The Seniors will carry the torch on Thursday with the day's activities getting underway around 11 A.M. They plan some really crazy activities such as outhouse races, sleuce racing, scavenger hunts, broomball games, a greased pig on the ice, and many other ridiculous antics which are a part of the carnival spirit. There

will be an afternoon pub and one in the evening to be followed by a moonlite skate. There will also be a movie on Thursday evening. Music for Thursday evening will be Stan Watson and the Bavarian Woodchoppers.

Friday, it is the Sophomore's turn. They have suggested a snowmobile rally, more antics in the rink, a lounge in the afternoon, a hockey game against Acadia in the evening, a bash with Edward Bear in the gym, and a midnight movie.

Saturday, the Freshmen take over. They want to get started early with a pancake breakfast, followed by a

snowman building contest, an outdoor football game, a field day in the gym, sleigh rides and an afternoon pub. The freshman class will host the Carnival Ball Saturday evening at the Confederation Center with music by Natural Affair. Afterwards, they will be hosting a get-together for those who don't want to stop.

Sunday, the Juniors will wrap it all up. There is a hockey game and a basketball game in the afternoon. Sunday event, Campus Cabaret will be performing at the Confederation Center. This is a U.P.E.I. production which promises to wrap up Carnival in top-notch fashion.

You have probably found this a very sketchy outline of Carnival. This is so because a lot of the particulars have not been finalized and a lot of badly needed bodies to put these ideas into effect just are not there. If you have any

## A Quick Report On The Sunday Council Meeting

The Student Council meeting last Sunday night, was very short, due to lack of things on the agenda, but more realistically because the Grey Cup Game was about to begin.

The proposed changes for the Student Union Constitution have been tabled till a later date, because it was felt that there were going to be more changes proposed this year. It was felt that it would be better to make all of the changes

at once.

A few suggestions were brought up by Nick Warman on how to improve the present parking situation. Council decided to present a brief to the Parking and Traffic Regulations Committee that recommends the Visitors Parking Lot not be "off Bounds" to members of the University community.

The Council also put through two other bills, one which extended the term of office for councilors to

April 30 to coincide with that of the executives, and a bill that officially made the Senior Citizen Club a sub-organization of the Student Union.

The Council is presently looking for people who are interested in working on the Senate sub-committee to review timetables, and will soon be seeking someone to replace our Speaker, whose resignation is for December 31.
