KRUGER STATES HIS CASE.

Declaration Concerning the Dispute Made to an American Paper

Chicago, Sept. 28.—A special correspondent of the Chicago Record writes from Pretoria, the capital of the South African Republic, under date of August 29: Last night I interviewed Oom Paul, the veteran President of the Republic. I found him busy with his house Bible searching for enlightenment from the pages of the book of books in his present difficulty. Paul Kruger is nearly 74 years of age, and it is hard to persuade a man who has seen life as he has to alter his ways at that age. Hence modern arguments in favour of placing the alien on absolutely equal terms with the old burgher generally fail to impress this old rugged product of a period when horse, rifle and his Bible were the only necessary equipments for the enjoyment of life in the wilderness of Africa.

"I have given away," said Oom Paul to me, "until all that remains now to be given is the country itself. What more do you want? I have often told you in former years," continued he, "when heavy trouble overshadowed our land, that I would sooner go into my grave than see the white races of South Africa engaged in bloody war with each other. We are the smaller and weaker State; it is our duty to concede, and we have done our duty and continue to do so, but if Britain desires to fight us with the might and resources of her Empire on a difference in two years in the franchise law, to take away that independence which was really granted to us by the immortal Gladstone in 1851; if for such a paltry reason we are to be wipped out as an independent people, then I say the Almighty will stand with the defence of just rights in defence of our dear land, which has been fought for by us and our fathers inch by inch by the savage hordes who made it their stronghold fifty years ago.

"Tell them," said Pres. Kruger, rising to emphasize his words, "tell your friends in America when you write them to refer to their own glorious history when thinking of us. They had their struggle for liberty, for independence, for national glory. I thought we had gone through it here long ago. It seems the real struggle is only commencing. But leave me now; let my thoughts not be drawn from my work. I am looking for guidance in my great trouble to Him who is the only One who can help us in distress. Good night."

I left the old President poring over the huge Bible in search of wisdom more than ever impressed with the trust he has in the Lord as the maker and unmaker of nations on the earth.
