MR. SPEAKER, I MAY BE PERMITTED TO SAY THAT AT NO PERIOD IN THE HISTORY OF CANADA HAS A GOVERNMENT MET PARLIAMENT WITH THE FINANCIAL CONDITION OF THE COUNTRY IN THE POSITION IT IS TO DAY. AT NO PERIOD IN THE HISTORY OF CANADA HAS ITS CREDIT STOOD SO HIGH AS IT STANDS TO-DAY. AT NO PERIOD IN THE HISTORY OF CANADA, POSSIBLY, WAS THE COUNTRY, GENERALLY SPEAKING, AS PROSPEROUS AS, OR MORE PROSPEROUS THAN, IT IS TO DAY.

"BUT TO-DAY WE STAND HERE NOT WITH ANY DOUBT AS TO ITS REVENUE PRODUCING POWER BUT WITH EVIDENCE OF THE LAST YEAR BEFORE US (1881), WITH THE PUBLIC ACCOUNTS AND STATEMENTS ON THE TABLE OF THE HOUSE, SHOWING NOT ONLY NO DEFICIT, BUT INSTEAD OF AN ESTIMATED SURPLUS OF \$2,000,000, THERE IS A SURPLUS OF \$4,132,743 IN THE TREASURY!"
