## JAPAN AND RUSSIA.

**A Practical Test to be Applied.**

**Great Britain and Japan Will Take Common Action.**

LONDON, Jan. 26.—The Daily Mail says that a Japanese trader will shortly land Japanese goods at Tallin-Wan with the object of testing whether or not that port is to be regarded as being open or under Russian control.

The outcome of this action will undoubtedly influence the relations between Russia and Japan.

The paper adds that every detail respecting the common action by Great Britain and Japan in Chinese waters has been definitely agreed upon.—Japan being, as she has been throughout, the moving spirit.

## AN UNFRIENDLY ACT.

**Visit of United States Warship To Havana.**

**May Provoke a Conflict.**

MADRID, Jan. 26.—The newspapers here generally comment upon Secretary Long's explanation of the visit to the United States battleship Maine at Havana and agree in expressing the opinion that her visit is inopportune and calculated to encourage the insurgents.

It is announced that, following Washington's example, the Spanish Government will instruct Spanish warships to visit a few American ports.

The impartial expresses the fear that the despatch of the battleship Maine to Havana will provoke a conflict and adds that Europe cannot overlook the American attitude towards Spain. But the Spanish people, if necessary, will do their duty their duty with honor.

OTTAWA, Jan. 25.—The militia officers who are shooting men are commencing to speculate on the command of the Bisley team. A Quebec or Maritime Province man will get the command as Ontario had it last year. If a Lower Province man is chosen, the adjutancy will go to Captain Smith of the St. John Rifles. If a Quebec man secures command, then Captain Helmer of the 43rd battalion, Ottawa Rifles, stands a good show for the adjutancy.
