### Local and Other Items.

**ST. JAMES' CHURCH.**—Don't miss the organ recital to-night. It will be well worth attending.

**APPLES IN LONDON.**—Mr. Sherman Belcher of Upper Dyk, sent some Kingston apples to London recently and a fortnight ago he received returns of \$4 11 per barrel. Last week he received returns of \$4 42 per barrel for Kings and Blenheim.—Kentville Advertiser.

**ACCIDENTALLY SHOT.**—A young man Stanley Beckwith was accidentally killed in the woods near Tatamont, Mass., whilst hunting a few days ago. He had stooped over to pick up a rabbit which he had shot, and the gun was discharged, the muzzle at that instant being against his head.

**GIRLS PLAY FOOTBALL.**—According to a late despatch from St. Louis the Rough Riders Rugby, a football team composed of girls from the St. Louis high school, defeated the Washington eleven, a team of boys elected from private schools on Washington avenue, by a score of ten to 0. The game was divided into halves of thirty minutes each. At the close of the first half the girls had scored five points and the boys a big goose egg. In the second half the girls managed to keep their male competitors down to the whitewash stage. The game, which was the first of the kind played in St. Louis, was witnessed only by an invited audience and the principal of the schools which the players at end knew nothing about it. Otherwise there might have been interference.

**SALVATION ARMY.**—The well known effort of Self Denial Week will be observed throughout the Salvation Army in this territory from Nov 20th to 26th. The Army has few regular subscribers and its beneficent operations are maintained by the free will offerings of the people. This does not leave its leaders much margin to launch out in its vast missionary labors and extend its daily growing social institutions. The needs of the weather and the socially downfallen are chiefly such through the now world wide agency of Self Denial Week. Officers and soldiers of all ranks join in this mighty effort, denying themselves in many cases even of what may be considered the necessities of life, that the proceeds of this week may be capable of great realization. In this endeavor all outside friends and sympathizers of the work are invited to join in gift or sacrifice.

### RUSSIA AND ENGLAND.

**Count Cassini Believes That Friendly Relations Will Continue.**

WASHINGTON, Nov 14.—The Russian ambassador, Count Cassini, who is just back from an extended vacation at the seashores and mountains, was seen today at the Russian embassy where he talked in a most interesting manner on international questions, particularly the reported strained relations between Russia and Great Britain, growing out of the conditions in China, and also the attitude of the great powers of Europe during the recent Spanish-American war. It had been understood that Count Cassini was about to be transferred to London, as his long residence in China, where he represented Russia when Port Arthur was acquired, would make his services of special value at this time. The ambassador says, however, that Baron de Stael will continue ambassador at London, and he expressed satisfaction that will permit him to remain in Washington. When Count Cassini was asked concerning the recent reports that Russia had seized the important Chinese treaty port of Neu Chwang, followed by great activity in the British naval yards with a prospect of an open rupture between Russia and Great Britain, he said too much credence is given these war rumors, and that present conditions give assurance of continued friendly relations between Russia and Great Britain. There has been no confirmation, he said, of the report that Russia had occupied Neu Chwang and he proceeded to point out that such an occupation by Russia was quite necessary, as she had already acquired the most advantageous naval and military port in Port Arthur, and a commercial port in Tien-Wan. Port Arthur was not only valuable as a naval and military base, but it would serve as the southern terminus of the great trans-Siberian railway when the project was carried through. It was being pushed forward rapidly, and the ambassador says the present outlook is for the completion of the railway within three and one-half years. One line runs north to Vladivostok, where the harbor on the Pacific is closed for four months of a year, while the southern line terminating at Port Arthur will give Russia a Pacific port open the year round, both for military and commercial purposes.

### NEWS NOTES.

The opinion, of Rome, referring to the possibility of an attempt by Russia to occupy the Sultanate of K. Beita, on the Red Sea, says that it has authority to assert that England will support Italy in preventing its seizure and adds: "The understanding with the English Government on the question of mutual action against French and Russian encroachments is perfect."

Despite the critical state of affairs in the West Indies and the total failure of the Mansion House Relief Fund, the Government has not yet taken any steps in the direction of furnishing assistance to the ruined West Indies. Unless something be done speedily, these poor people will conclude that Mr. Chamberlain intends to abandon them to their fate.

Leading Liberals continue to strengthen the Government's backbone in dealing with Egypt. Sir Edward Grey, M. P., speaking at Ashington on Saturday, voiced the opinion of Liberals on the subject of Egypt's future, saying that, although Great Britain went to Egypt promising and intending to evacuate, circumstances had created fresh obligations, resulting in a position which any British Government was bound to maintain.

The reward to British officers and men engaged in the recent successful campaign in the Sudan are not ended by the bestowal of medals and decorations. Lord Wolseley, in a special army order, states that gratuities ranging from £3 for class 5 of private soldiers to £225 for the major general are to be paid to every officer and soldier employed south of Wada Halfa. In special cases, upon recommendation of general officers commanding in Egypt, gratuities will be received also by officers and men employed at Wada Halfa and Assouan.

News has come from the Sudan that the last Dervish army has been dispersed. For some time since his defeat at Gedaref, on the Abyssinian border, Ahmed Ed-di has maintained his position near Col. Parsons' troops. A force under Major-General Rundle, however, moved up the Blue Nile, thus cutting off Ahmed Ed-di's retreat. The result of this step was the wholesale disintegration of the Dervish army. Five hundred Jehadiel, or black riflemen, came over and joined Col. Parsons in a body on October 31, and they were followed by a steady stream of members of Ahmed Ed-di's army going to ask for pardon at Gedaref. The Dervish leader, with his Bagaras and a number of other followers, fled to the southeast.
