CONTRACT BRIDGE

You are South, both sides vulnerable. The bidding has been:

South	West	North	East
1♥	Pass	2♣	Pass
2♥	Pass	2♠	Pass
?	?	?	?

What do you now bid with each of the following four hands?

1. ♠KJ3 ♥AQJ984 ♦J6 ♣75
 2. ♠964 ♥A38752 ♦AQ ♣KJ
 3. ♠K8 ♥KQ8643 ♦AJ32 ♣4
 4. ♠Q943 ♥AQJ74 ♦AJ2 ♣9
1. Three hearts. Both the two club and two spade bids by responder, are forcing bids. North, being new suits named and South must bid again. Obviously, North has a good hand, since he insists South speak again despite the signoff bid of two hearts.
- All South can now do is warn partner again that the opening bid was weak. By failing to support clubs or raise spades and by failing to bid two notrump, North is advised that so far as the opener is concerned the hand is good only for a heart part score contract. If North goes on after this warning, it is on his own power.
2. Three notrump. Signoff bids can be of different caliber. For example, the two heart rebid on this hand was based on stronger, all around values than in the previous hand.

British Trade Balance Slips

LONDON (Reuters) — Britain ended 1957 with a slightly worse trade balance than in 1956 despite a record-breaking foreign commerce year, figures released by the board of trade showed Monday.

Preliminary statistics for visible trade, such as manufactured goods, showed the deficit of exports over imports for 1957 was £520,000,000.

Compared with 1956, the trade drop was £52,000,000 on visible trade.

This debit is expected to be cut by half when 1958 figures are determined on such invisible trade items as overseas investments, overseas services and internal tourism. They totalled about £200,000,000 in 1955 and 1956.

British exports and re-exports rose four per cent to a record total of £3,460,000,000 in 1957. But imports also increased five per cent to another record figure of £4,079,000,000.

The preliminary figures showed total British exports to North America went up 4.5 per cent to £439,000,000; with almost all the increase going to Canada.

Stolen Cheques Cause Trouble

OTTAWA (CP) — RCMP said Monday they are being rung answering calls as a group of forged-cheque passers cash payroll cheques stolen Friday from the federal treasury office.

One suspect has been arrested. RCMP Inspector H.S. Cooper of Ottawa division said his men are on the trail of others.

Upwards of 20 cheques, made out for between \$80 and \$150, and surrounding area. In all, 1,500 blank end-of-the-month payroll cheques were reported stolen.

One suspect was arrested Monday in Hull, Que., when he tried to pay a small grocery order with a cheque made out for \$142.
