Patrick Intends To Protect Doug

MONTREAL (CP) — Muzz Patrick, general manager of New York Rangers, said Tuesday he will protect all-star Doug Harvey against being drafted by other National Hockey League club today.

Harvey announced his resignation as Rangers' playing coach Monday night. Patrick said he felt forced to protect Harvey although it appeared to be wanting one of the maximum 18 players he can

protect along with two goalies. He said the only thing that would change the situation is if the five other clubs came to him and offered not to claim Harvey in the draft. But he said he will not go to the other clubs himself and he doesn't expect them to approach him.

He again said he hopes Harvey might reconsider but if a choice for a successor must be made, it is mostly likely the Rangers will look inside their own organization.
