Oddfellowship.

The Sovereign Grand Lodge concluded its session at Portland, Oregon, on Saturday last. We clip the following from the Grand Sire's report: Grand Sire Busbee's report pays flattering tribute to the zeal of Deputy Grand Sire Campbell, upon whom has been bestowed much of the labor of the administration, owing to the illness of its chief. The report goes on to state that the net increase of active lodge membership from Jan. 1, 191, to Jan. 1, 1892, was 48,807. This is the largest increase ever made in a single year in the history of the order. The lodge membership in good standing on the 1st of last January had reached the enormous total of 721,146, and including the sisters of the order, 802,881. The expenditure for relief, the test of the order's fraternalism of the order, during 1891 was \$3,176,388.08. It is interesting to compare the relative progress of the order with that made by its English brethren. On January 1, 1890, the membership of the Manchester Unity of Old Fellows exceeded the American membership by 14,316. On January 1, 1892, the membership of the Independent Order of Old Fellows exceeded that of the Manchester Unity by 3,378. The total membership of both on January 1, 1892, aggregated 1,572,384, a membership largely greater than that of any benevolent society on the face of the globe. The total revenues of the American order for the year amounted to \$6,956,064. H. E. V. DeBoissiere has made most efficient gift to the order in Kansas, to establish a home and industrial school. The princely contribution is estimated at two hundred thousand dollars.

Seeding Wheat.

The Ohio agricultural experiment station has for several years been investigating such problems in wheat culture as the quantity of seed per acre, the depth of seeding, drilling versus broadcast, the mixing of different varieties, cross drilling and the use of the roller press. The average results favor sowing at the rate of five to seven pecks per acre of thoroughly cleaned seed, and sowing this to a depth of two inches deep. In favorable seasons broadcast seeding has produced about a half a crop a drilling, but if the seeding was a half and dry, drilling is likely to give the best results. No advantage has yet been discovered in the mixing of different varieties. There has been a slight increase of crop where the wheat was cross drilled, the same quantity of seed being used in each case. This increase may be partly due to the more thorough pulverization of the soil accomplished by the double drilling. The roller press—a wheel following each of the drills—has not increased the yield sufficiently to warrant its use.

Electioneer has 108 trotters and one pacer in the 230 list.
E. Angeline, 2.11, and Alia, 2.12, are the fastest four-year-olds of the year.
The trotting record and the pacing record now stand tied at 2.04.
The fastest trotting race record is Martha Wilkes, 2.08.
The fastest pacing race record is Masoot, 2.04.
The fastest stallion race record, trotting, is Le Masco, 2.11.
Guy Wilkes is the youngest sire to have three with records of 2.15 or better.
Nancy and Martha are two old-fashioned nuns, but the two mares who bear them are of the latest style.

SUGAR SHIPMENTS TO THE STATES.—One of the peculiarities of the sugar situation in Cuba is the shipment of yellows from the Haiti refinery to the United States. The consignments sent forward so far have netted the refiners \$3.60 per hundred weight, which is slightly above the average recent net wholesale price in the local market.

BIG YIELD OF OATS.—A Georgetown gentleman writes the St. John Sun as follows: "Having just threshed my oats, I would like to record what is considered here an unusually large yield of grain for the amount sown. From six and one-half bushels sown last spring, we threshed two hundred and thirty bushels, or a yield of over 35 to 1. This amount of seed was sown on five acres of ground. I may add the seed was sown by hand and the grain stood very evenly."

During last week 20,479 barrels of apples were shipped from Montreal to Europe.
