Prov. Government Appoints Deputy Fisheries Minister

The appointment of Mr. Eugene M. Gorman as Deputy Minister of Fisheries and also that of Mr. Earl MacLeod to the position of Provincial Fire Marshal, was announced by Premier Matheson following a meeting of the Government this week.

Mr. Gorman, as Director of Fisheries in the Department of Industry and Natural Resources for the past five years, was largely responsible for many advances in the interests of the fisheries and is credited with designing much of the equipment necessary to adopt trawlers to meet the requirements of the Island area.

Previous to his appointment as Director, he had been Chairman of the Fishermen's Loan Board. Mr. Gorman attended St. Dunstan's University from 1937 to 1941 when he graduated with the degree of B. A. He taught at the University for two years and in 1942 he went overseas with the Knight's of Columbus services where he remained until 1946.

Construction Of New Nurses Residence At Falconwood Under Way

The contract for the construction of the new nurses residence at the Active Treatment Centre at Falconwood has been awarded to County Construction Limited for the amount of \$119,340. The only other tender on the building was that of M.F. Schurman for \$123,000.

EOKA Rejects U.K. Terms
