Ms. Bryanton, who resides in Hampshire, PEI was presented with the award during the opening reception of the Annual Atlantic COPUS Conference held at UPEI on February 2-4th.

Ms. Bryanton obtained her B.A. Degree majoring in Canadian studies from UPEI as a mature student and is currently working towards a diploma in Public Administration as a part time student. Ms. Bryanton served as COPUS Provincial coordinator for PEI as Vice-President, and two years as National President. She also sup-

ported the formation of Mapus, served on its executive and continues to be involved in Mapus activities.

COPUS was formed in 1977 in response to the needs and concerns of part-time university students across Canada. It's mandate (1989) now includes all post-secondary part-time students and it frequently represents the concerns of mature full-time post secondary students. Mapus is a full member of COPUS and was established in 1982 to ensure that mature full-time and part-time students are an intergral and acknowledged part of the UPEI community. At UPEI almost 40% of the student population is made up of mature full-time and part-time students. Conservative estimates of university attendance across Canada indicate that currently only half of the university student population is made up of students who enter immediately following high school in a full time basis.
