**NEGOTIATIONS IN BEHRING SEA CLAIMS.**

WASHINGTON, Oct. 29.—Captain Calvin L. Hooper, of the revenue cutter Rush, who was last year in charge of four revenue patrol in Behring Sea, has been summoned to Washington to confer with the state department and treasury officials in regard to the proposed new treaty for a mixed commission to establish damages suffered by Canadian sealers in Behring Sea. The Captain is expected to arrive about November 1. The desire expressed for Captain Hooper's presence indicates that the negotiations between Secretary Olney and the British ambassador and his Canadian advisers will not be concluded in anything like short order as the Canadian visitors seemed to expect. The probabilities now seem to be that the negotiations will extend over several weeks. It is understood the Canadians have advanced their demands and insist upon an allowance of interest. This will be strongly contested by the United States. There are a number of other questions not definitely settled by the Paris award upon which the issue may be joined.
