Swiss Women's Organization Counters Female Vote Threat

BERN, Switzerland (AP) — A national women's organization has just come to life in Switzerland — to ward off the growing threat of votes for women.

Swiss women are the last in Europe without the right to vote. Suffragettes have been campaigning for political rights since early in the century, but the anti-suffragettes are something new.

Our enemies were gaining ground, so we had to organize," says Mrs. Gertrud Haldimann, president of a group called the Federation of Swiss Women Against Female Suffrage.

Mrs. Haldimann, 32-year-old doctor of pharmacology and mother of six children, has no membership statistics of her anti-suffragette movement.
