More Canadian Paintings Bought

OTTAWA (CP)—The national gallery has bought more Canadian works of art ranging from the old masters to contemporary. Alan Jarvis, gallery director announced Thursday that a group of important acquisitions was made by the gallery trustees last week.

Heading the list is a large group of Canadian paintings, sculptures, prints and drawings now on display at the gallery.

Examples of all periods were purchased, including a portrait by Louis Dulongpre (1754-1843) and a landscape by Joseph Legare (1795-1855). There are also paintings by Paul Kane (1810-1871) and John A. Fraser (1838-1898); and works of contemporary artists Maxwell Bates of Calgary, Bruno Bobak and Joseph Plaskett of Vancouver; Ann Kahana, Jean-Paul Mousseau and Maurice Raymond of Montreal; and Jean-Paul Lemieux of Quebec City.

Halifax To Enter Twin Program

SHERBROOKE, Que. (CP)—Halifax has agreed to become Sherbrooke's twin under a program designed to bring people of Canadian communities closer together.

Mayor L. A. Kitz of Halifax said in a letter to Mayor Armand Nadeau that city council had approved Sherbrooke's suggestion that the two cities become twins. Mayor Kitz said the move will broaden friendly relations between the two cities and be of mutual advantage to them.

The twinning of cities has been advocated by the Canadian Federation of Mayors and Municipalities to improve relations among people in different parts of the country.

Other twins include Windsor, Ont., and Granby, Que., and Hamilton and Shawinigan Falls, Que.
