ing demand on the part of farmers for meetings of this type COUNTRY MAGAZINE Country Magazine the national Monday night one hour radio program on February 14 discussed at considerable length rural development in this province. The period covered was roughly five years and a number of people who had been involved were interviewed and their reactions noted. Repeatedly the commentator referred to the fact that Islanders were prone to be guided by tradition and were reluctant to change unless the advantages were very obvious. Also suggested was a certain element of defeatism, the attitude, "If it will work here it would have been tried some other place."

The concluding part of the program was a statement on poverty by R. Alex Simm and a quite long letter supposedly from a boy who has gone to the city and writes his mother to discuss what he considers were advantages and disadvantages back home on the farm.

Generally we believe that the program on Monday evening radio is one which farm people, in fact, other people too should put on their list.

HOG PROSPECTS

Without any doubt the hog producers are feeding high on the hog at the moment and prospects are for the least to continue certainly for the next six months.

As of December 1 hog numbers were down 8 per cent in Canada over the previous year. There is evidence of an increase in farrowing for December, January and February of some 20 per cent and evidence of a 10 per cent increase for the spring but these figures certainly do not add up to over production.

During January 1966 Grade A hogs averaged at Toronto \$42.57 per hundredweight and that was \$15.25 above the average for January a year ago.

BEEF PROSPECTS

Indications are for rising cattle prices possibly for the next three years. Up to the point the beefman hasn't for sometime been sharing in the mild booms which potato, egg and hog people have enjoyed. However, it now looks as if beef is going to have its inning for a while. Some planning now will enable farmers to take advantage of these improved prices.

This may soon start to sound as a cracked record but we have had three and one-half months of what amounts, measured by Island standards, to an ideal winter.

To date there hasn't been a really severe day and while the snowfall has been light the fields still have a satisfactory covering. The Gulf of St. Lawrence is free of ice, the Charlottetown Harbour is opening up, the Georgetown Harbour is open and, in short, it is easy to become enthusiastic about winter 1965-66.

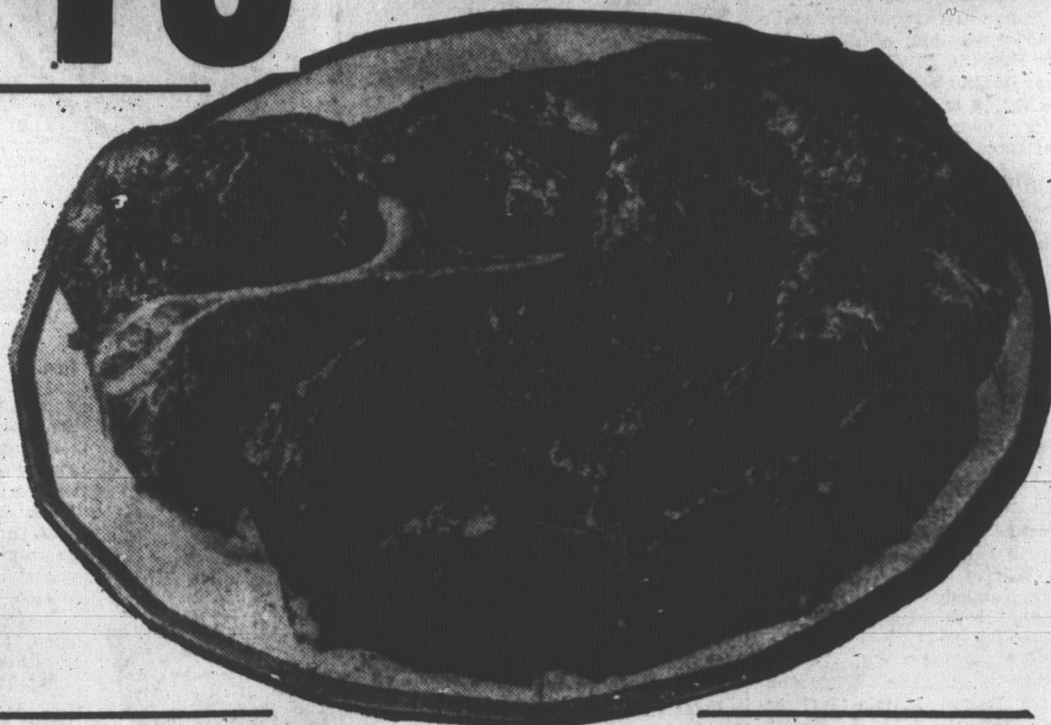

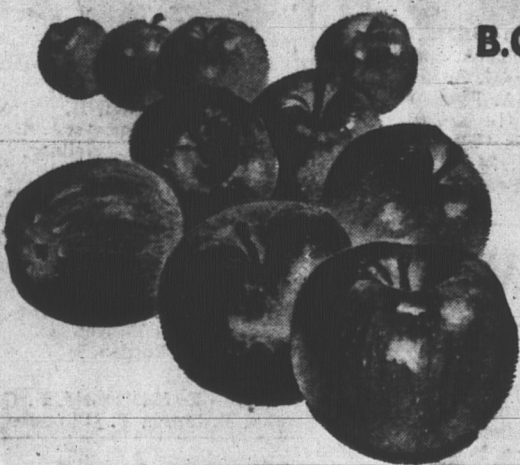

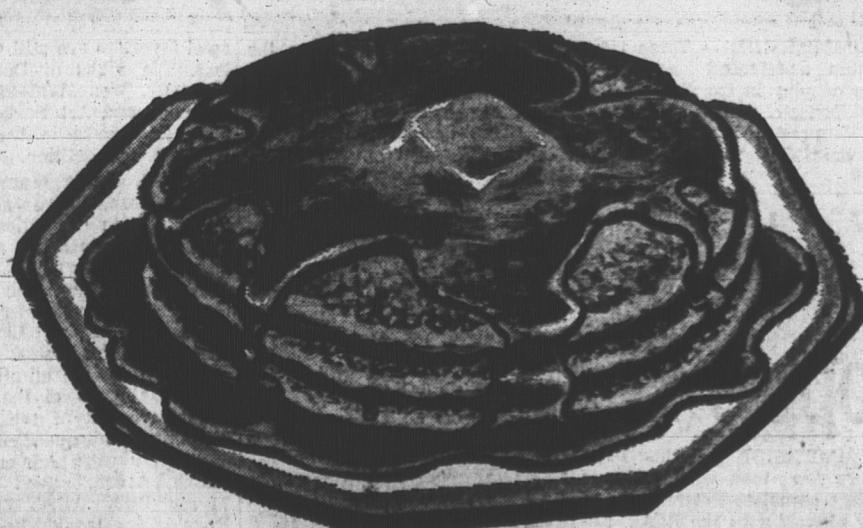
