The Cholera.

An enterprising correspondent has obtained and cabled to this country the opinions of two eminent French savants—Mr. Pasteur and Dr. Vulpian—in regard to the outbreak of cholera at Toulon, in that country. M. Pasteur referring to the immediate cause of the disease, said: "There is surely a microbe of cholera. Cholera comes from India, where it is epidemic." M. Pasteur added that the best preventive is good hygiene, and above all, the avoidance of water from wells in affected towns. M. Vulpian declares that corrosive sublimate is the best disinfectant in drains and closets for apartments. He recommended phenic acid, and he advised anybody suffering from diarrhoea to take immediately ten drops of laudanum in a glass of water. When the cholera has once declared itself, it should be treated with opium. Since absorption is difficult and sometimes impossible to cholera patients, alkaloids should be employed, of which morphine is the most powerful. M. Vulpian continued by repeating that morphine will be the great remedy, should unfortunately an epidemic break forth, as it is quite possible. We again repeat that cleanliness and effective sewerage, such as can only be had through frequent flushing of the sewers, is the great safeguard against that plague, should it unfortunately cross the Atlantic as it did in the summer of 1854.—Hamilton Times.

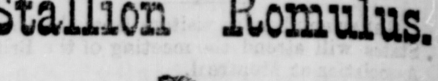

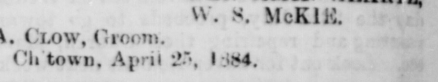

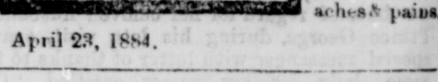
