

\$300 Netted In Store Break

SUMMERSIDE — A break into Gaudet's Save-Easy supermarket, which netted thieves about \$300, and an attempted break into Atlantic Wholesalers on Water Street are under investigation here by town police.

The supermarket break, discovered yesterday morning when the store was opened, is believed to have been made between 4 a.m. and 7:30 a.m. yesterday.

Mark Gaudet, proprietor of the store, said thieves caused thousands of dollars damage to the store in addition to the cash haul of \$300 when they

smashed open cash registers and a beverage machine.

He said he thought only money was taken from the store. An expensive camera on an office desk had been overlooked.

He said food from the store stock was strewn throughout the building, indicating the thief or thieves had been in the store a considerable length of time.

Entry was made through a rear window after a screen and bars had been removed. Residents in the Water Street store area alerted police to an attempt being made at a second break through a window of Atlantic Wholesalers.

Police investigated immediately but found no one on the premises.

It was not known whether the two incidents were related.

City Man Sentenced 10 Days In Intoxicated Driving Case

Vincent E. McGarry, Iona, was charged with speeding and failing to stop at a stop sign. He was fined \$15 and costs or five days for the former charge and \$5 and costs or 10 days for the latter.

Joseph Gallant and Allen Smethurst both of Charlottetown were each charged with driving under duress (possession of fire-crackers). The former was fined \$25 and costs or 15 days and the latter was given a reprimand.

Two persons charged with illegal possession of liquor were each fined \$20 and costs or 30 days.

There were seven cases of drunk and incapable. Three of the accused were each given a 20-day suspended sentence for their first offence. Two accused were each fined \$20 and costs or 20 days while another was fined \$20 and costs or 10 days. One accused was given 20 days in jail.

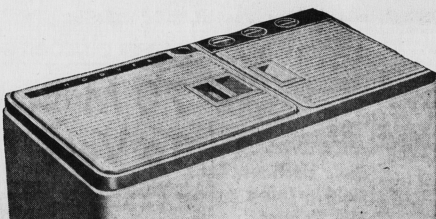
