Phillies Get Even Break With Cubs; Dodgers Sweep Series With Pittsburgh Pirates

By Guardian's Special Wire) NEW YORK, July 19.—The Phillies did most of the hitting in their doubleheader with Chicago Cubs today but achieved nothing better than an even break, winning the second game at Chicago 4-1 after dropping a 2-1 decision to the National League champions in the opener.

The Cardinals celebrated Jesse Haines' 43rd birthday at home by sweeping both ends of a doubleheader from Boston Bees 8-1 and 7-2 and giving the veteran hurler his fifth victory against no losses this season. The two wins moved the Cards within one game of the leading Cubs.

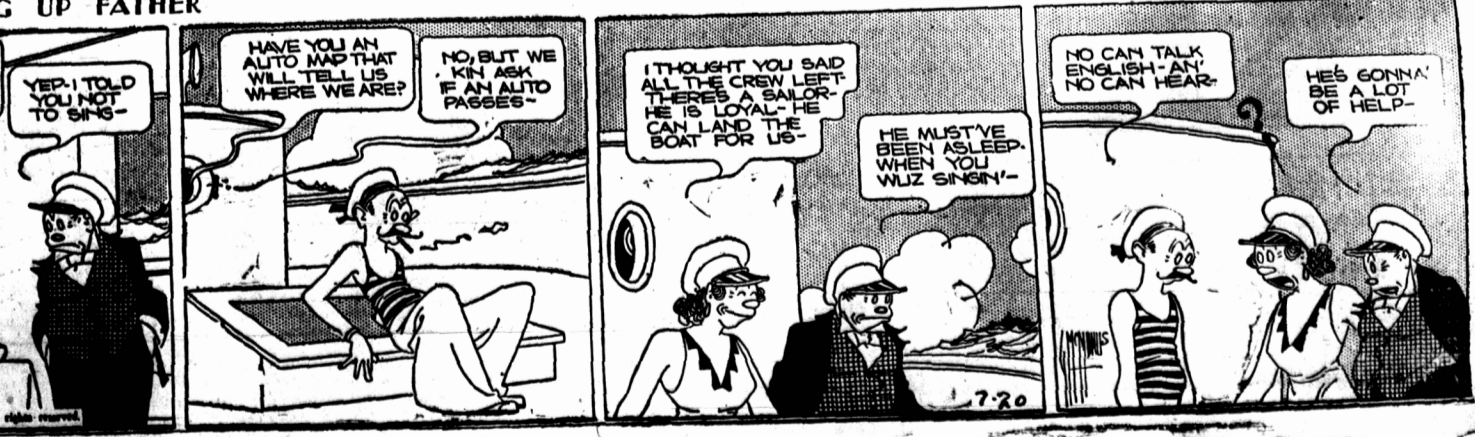
