The Summerside Aces finally chalked up a victory over Amherst, taking the Ramblers by the score of 9-5 at Civic Stadium last night. The visitors had a wide margin of play in the first frame, but the fine work of Thane "Whitey" Mann in the Aces cage held them to a 2-1 margin in scoring. About half way through the second period with the score 3-1 for the Ramblers, the Aces started to come on, and the middle period ended 3-3 in their favor. They potted 4 goals to the Ramblers' two in the final session and skated off the ice with a four goal edge for their second victory over Amherst this season.

Coke Grady, Lorne Hennessey and Wallie Shepherd each scored a pair of goals for the winners, with Vance Harris, Gord Cutcliffe and Ron MacArthur getting singletons. Boss, Gaudet, Belliveau, Langille, and Leder fired one apiece for the Ramblers. Amherst opened the scoring at 6:23 of the first period, Boss beating Mann from fairly close in. The Aces evened it up when Coke Grady raced down the right boards in pursuit of a puck sliding towards the Amherst end of the rink.
