Rev. C. P. Wilson, late of the Diocese of Fredericton, N. B., has been appointed Rector at Pigeonwash.

The Duke of Newcastle, who is visiting Boston, will make an extensive tour of the country previous to his return to England. He is eighteen years of age.

London Academy:—"To ordinary mortals who are depressed by the consciousness of a torpid liver, by the length of butchers' bills, by the discord of street music or by any other of the unavoidable ills of life there is something exasperating in the contemplation of unfeeling high spirits."

Sir Thomas Watson, the famous English physician, is seriously ill, and not expected to recover. He is now ninety-one years old. A stroke of paralysis has prostrated him, but left him in possession of his mental faculties. When stricken down, he calmly remarked to an attendant:—"This is the beginning of the end."

When Prince Bismarck is very eager to take a Parliamentary trick he plays the king. So when the Landtag was opened yesterday, the Emperor of Germany was present and read the members a little lecture on the disobedience of the Reichstag and the pain it had given to their worthy Chancellor. Unfortunately for Prince Bismarck the Deputies know his game too well, and whenever he plays his king they play their ace. Thus when the Emperor announced in his speech that he was now on excellent terms with the Vatican the conservatives determined to withdraw their support, and the best friends of the Government were alienated. So Prince Bismarck loses his trick, and by the end of the session he will probably have lost the game.

Senor Castelar will shortly publish a manifesto to the constituencies advising the Democrats to take an active share in the legal struggle to be recommended as the best means for developing the political education of the democracy. Senor Castelar states that experience has taught him to prefer evolution to revolution. He envies the orderly parliaments of England and the United States and proclaims his republican connections and aspirations. He and his friends will pursue their way toward a steady, solid republic. He would like to place amid the confusion of parties one fixed, steady rallying point for all democratic schools. He repels all idea of coalition with the extreme republicans, even for electoral purposes. The manifesto is signed by eighteen Deputies and Senators.

Dr. William Wright, the editorial superintendent of the British and Foreign Bible Society, in a recent letter to the London Times relates the following interesting fact about Professor Palmer, who has doubtless been killed in Egypt:—"His last great, and perhaps the most important work of his life before leaving England was the final revision of Henry Martyn's Persian New Testament. Dr. Bruce, of Julfa, had spent many years revising the book and he and Professor Palmer spent six months together in comparing the translation with the Greek, and fitting it exactly to the Persian idiom. When any difficulty arose with regard to theological terms, it was marvelous the facility with which Professor Palmer could quote from memory one Persian author after another to settle the exact application of the word in question. Dr. Bruce, who had been a long time in Persia, considered Professor Palmer's help indispensable, and he acknowledged in the most unreserved manner his great obligation to him. The last proof-sheets are just now issuing from the press in beautiful type, and it is with a sad but affectionate interest that we associate the two names of these two most gifted men, Henry Martyn and E. H. Palmer."

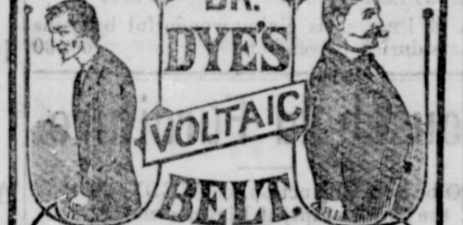

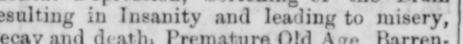
