Time Lag Is Reason Given For Increased Cost Of Ferry

A time lag of several years between the time the original estimate was made and when construction of the ferry Lord Selkirk was started was given yesterday as the major reason why the final cost of the ferry exceeded the original estimate by \$1,993,000.

The near \$2,000,000 difference was questioned in Parliament by Auditor-General Watson Sellar who queried why "the transport department paid \$3,079,000 - excluding \$372,060 in architects fees for the car ferry although the original estimate was \$1,086,000, and no firm price was negotiated by the builder."

Local sources said yesterday that the original estimate was made back in 1950 when a ship to serve between Wood Islands, P.E.I., and Caribou, N.S. was under preliminary consideration. The ship finally put into operation little resembles the one originally proposed, according to these sources.

It was also pointed out that extreme changes in material costs took place between 1950 and when the actual building took place.

The design was changed several times before plans were finally approved and carried to completion.

Judgment was then given for the defendant for \$333.3 plus two-thirds of his costs.
