APPLY LIME IN THE FALL.

IT IS A SOIL-ENRICHEN AND THIS IS THE TIME TO USE IT. Makes Heavy Soils Lighter—And Also Helps to Make Light Soils Heavier—The Simple Chemistry of It.

The best period of the year for the application of lime to the soil is in the fall. Lime is a plant food, and essential and while it exists to a more or less extent in all soils yet it proves beneficial on both heavy and light lands, assisting to render heavy soils lighter and light soils heavier.

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
