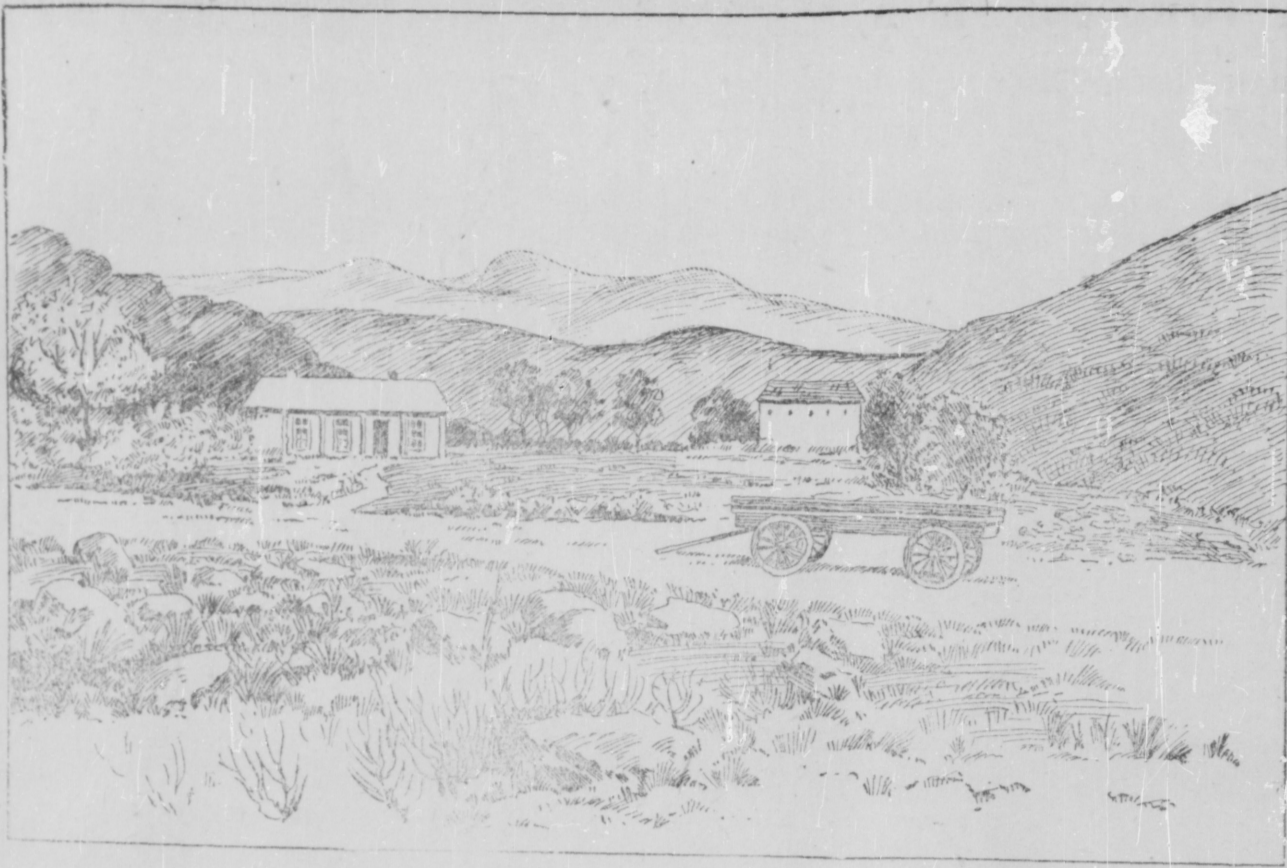

WAR IN SOUTH AFRICA.

Interesting Particulars of the Struggle Between Great Britain and the Boers.

BULLER'S SPLENDID MEN.

To one who has not accompanied a British Army on a campaign for a considerable time past, the superiority of the rank and file of the present day is very noticeable. They are older, steadier, and more reliable than they used to be, speaking generally, and more especially of the infantry regiments. There is something very admirable about "Tommy." There is a delightful simplicity about him. Of course, he grumbles he could never get on without that; and his language is shocking, but he is in many respects generous and unselfish, his discipline is splendid, and his indifference to danger is admirable. There is nothing boastful about him, and he does many fine actions without in the least knowing that he has done anything out of the common. He takes everything as it comes with the most delightful indifference. He does not worry himself in the least when going into action with thoughts of getting killed or wounded—it's all in the day's work. Up to a certain point these men all act alike, but when danger becomes very imminent, when the enemy press very closely, and shot and shell begin cutting men down wholesale, then gradually the men act individually; some show a strong disposition to retire, some show temper, and want to get at close quarters with their foe. It is at these critical moments that the British officer, almost without exception comes out well. While the men are advancing in skirmishing order, lying down often as possible, the officer is not so much in evidence, but when this hesitation begins to manifest itself up leaps the officer, colonel or subaltern, exposing himself to the enemy's fire more or less according to the necessity of the case. "Steady, men!" "Forward there on the left!" Sometimes there is evidence of a slight panic in the ranks, in which case officers still further expose themselves, and what they say to the men is not to be found in the soldier's pocket-book. It is on these occasions that casualties amongst officers are so heavy; fortunately, they are of rare occurrence.—H. H. S. Pearce, in Daily News.

NEW ZEALAND'S POSITION.

The first notification of a desire to form part of the great British Imperial Federation has emanated from New Zealand in the form of a cablegram from the Governor to the Imperial Government. History is being made with

such rapidity that the far-reaching effects of such a cablegram have not yet been realized. Yet, taken in conjunction with the action of Australia generally, and of Canada, it fully demonstrates that there is complete harmony and unity of purpose between the component parts of the vast Empire in everything relating to Imperial interests. Imperial Federation, long the ideal of far-sighted politicians, is fast becoming an actual achievement, a matter of practical current politics. Here is the document, which is one of inestimable political importance:—

"People of New Zealand wish to express their endorsement of the position taken up by the Imperial Government, declining to allow the intervention of any foreign Power in the settlement to be arrived with the Transvaal Republic and Orange Free State, and not to assent to either State being independent. My Government assures her Majesty's Government that New Zealand will support to the last the Mother Country, as far as lies in their power, in maintaining that position which has been taken up, irrespective of consequences. I am desired to add, there are large numbers of men volunteering, who are good riders and shots, willing to go to South Africa for relief of Imperial forces if the services of the latter will be required elsewhere."

who was on Lord Roberts' personal staff and was captured by the Boers at Thaba N'Chu, escaped and, after two days' wandering arrived at the camp of the 12th Lancers. He was very weak. He arrived to-day and states that the Boers express their determination to keep up the fight, although they realize that their ultimate defeat is inevitable.

The Pro-Boer agitator, Mr Vansiclen, says the Delagoa Award was settled at Geneva on Tuesday, and the sum awarded is little short of five million dollars, including expenses. Others than the Boers are willing to pay the amount on suitable terms, and the Boers will be pleased to see it done in order to keep Delagoa Bay in Portuguese ownership. He himself has offered to advance the Lisbon Government six million dollars.
